THE LISTENING POST



A few years ago, when sharing with my Gramma about watching the new Mr. Rogers film starring Tom Hanks (a man she and I both adore), she recounted to me a story from my early childhood. She marveled at my behavior while watching Mr. Rogers and once asked me what I loved about his show. And I apparently said to her "Because, Gramma, he's talking TO ME. I listen to him and he listens to me." I found that fascinating, as I had learned that when Mr. Rogers looked into the camera during filming, he always pictured a child and looking into their eyes, as though they were right there with him. His attentiveness, his directness, it was all intentional for those who watched and participated in his neighborhood. And, at least for me, he succeeded in this.

I recently started a book about the simple faith of Mr. Rogers (yes, I'm finding time to read...sometimes.) This summer, not only do I plan to do a series of sharing about some of the theology and faith of Mr. Rogers Neighborhood in worship, but we will be having a Vacation Bible School themed around Mr. Rogers and his neighborhood this July. So I've downloaded a few books to refamiliarize myself with this gentle giant of a man.

In the first portion of this book, the author (Amy Hollingsworth), begins with a quote from Fred Rogers: "And so, for me, being quiet and slow is being myself, and that is my gift." To me, that indicates that Mr. Rogers was perhaps a man of great patience. He spent so much of his life in the company of children, I can't imagine patience not being a part of who he was. Patience was always a struggle for me and I think, because of that, is why I always had a lot going on. For a few years there, I worked full time in youth ministry, part time at an apartment complex, and attended seminary full time. I struggled to sit still for too long. Until my spiritual formation class required us to do 3 silent, half day retreats. Silent. No talking. No music. Not even instrumental music. It was, for me, BRUTAL. I wondered if a nap would count. (It didn't.)

That was more than ten years ago. I've changed a lot since then. Am I always slow...no. I still struggle to slow down. It's a concentrated effort to pause and reflect. But the quiet? I crave it. I stay up far too late sometimes and enjoy the peace and quiet of our home. I drive to church sometimes with zero music or podcasts. I've particularly enjoyed embracing quiet during this season of Lent. It's become a spiritual discipline for me, in a way.

We are not all who we were ten years ago. The world certainly isn't, that's for sure. Are there things that you embrace now that you balked at then? Are there ways in which you have remained the same as always? I take comfort in the fact that God's patience is overwhelming with me, and that God remains the same yesterday, today, and forever. Even if I (and the world) keep on changing.
