Student Activities Highlight Ashland School Board Meeting

Superintendent Steve Paramore highlighted several upcoming and recent school events during the Ashland City School District Board of Education meeting Monday, February 23.

Paramore praised the Ashland High School production of "Joseph and the Technicolor Dreamcoat," which was performed February 20 and 21. He also reminded staff and families that spring break is scheduled from Monday, March 30, through Monday, April 6, with classes resuming Tuesday, April 7.

The district's third annual Easter egg hunt for children ages 4 to 10 is scheduled for Thursday, April 9, at 6:30 p.m. at Community Stadium.

The superintendent recognized students of the month from all grade levels across the district, along with selected staff members. He noted that spring sports are beginning and that some student-athletes are also still competing in winter postseason events.

Paramore reviewed proposed policy updates needed to align district policies with current state and federal laws. Board President Pam Mowry said such revisions are required annually as legislation changes and described the updates as routine.

Treasurer Kyle Klingler presented the district's financial report and forecast, which were approved by the board.

The board also approved the superintendent's consent agenda, which included several personnel retirements, resignations and new hires.

Board members then entered executive session to discuss employment and personnel matters before adjourning.

New Tornado Sirens Planned for Mifflin, Sullivan Townships

The Ashland County Board of Commissioners approved cost estimates on Thursday for two solar-powered tornado sirens, including one replacement and one new installation.

The existing siren in Mifflin Township will be replaced at an estimated cost of \$33,720.57. Commissioner Denny Bittle said the siren is nearing the end of its service life and the replacement is routine.

A second solar tornado siren will be installed at the Black River Schools campus at an estimated cost of \$37,670.57. Bittle said the area is currently a dead spot where residents cannot hear the existing siren located in Sullivan.

The estimates were provided by VASU Communications. Bittle said solar sirens were chosen to reduce electricity costs and eliminate the need for generators.

Commissioners approved an agreement with VSWC Architects for \$24,500 to begin planning courthouse renovations. Bittle said the new county administration building is projected to be completed in early 2027 and he hopes renovation plans and cost estimates for the courthouse will be ready when that project is finished.

Commissioner James Justice said the county will be mindful of costs and does not plan to take out loans to complete the work. He said renovations are needed to ensure the local justice system has adequate space.

Most renovations will focus on the basement and first floor, creating a larger courtroom for the juvenile judge and space for the probation department, which is currently housed

in rented offices. The courthouse also lacks private meeting rooms for attorneys and clients.

An attendee asked about the courthouse's single point of entry. Officials said it will remain in place to meet safety requirements. All employees and anyone entering the courthouse are required to use the single point of entry.

Appropriations totaling \$6.532 million were approved from the capital projects fund for construction of the new administration building. Bittle said final costs could be closer to \$6.1 million due to optional changes for a water retention system.

Josh Cross, external affairs representative for Ohio Edison, presented information about the planned upgrade to smart meters for residential customers, starting in April and expected to be completed by October. He said customers can find details and frequently asked questions on the FirstEnergy website.

The board also approved the auction of surplus equipment through GovDeals, several travel requests, and an engagement letter with Kick and Gilman LLC to provide legal services for child welfare cases while the Department of Job and Family Services searches for an in-house attorney.

The next regular meeting is scheduled for 9 a.m. Thursday, March 5, in the second-floor conference room of the Ashland County Building, 110 Cottage St. Meetings are open to the public and streamed live on the "Ashland, OH County Government" Facebook page.

HOT WHITE CHOCOLATE BRANDY

Ingredients:

- 3 1/2 cups milk
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 package (6 oz) white chocolate baking squares, chopped
- 1/3 cup brandy
- 3 Tablespoons white creme de cacao

Garnish:

- Whipped topping
- Grated white chocolate

IRISH BROWN BREAD

Ingredients:

- 3 1/2 cups stone ground whole wheat flour
- 1 1/4 cups all purpose flour
- 1 1/2 cups natural bran
- 1 1/2 cups steel cut oats
- 4 teaspoons baking soda
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 4 teaspoons brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons sea salt
- 1/2 cup wheat germ
- 1 qt plus 1/2 cup buttermilk at room temperature

Directions:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F

In a large bowl use a large spoon to mix all dry ingredients until well combined. Add buttermilk and stir until dry ingredients are evenly moist.

Divide dough equally between two greased loaf pans (approximately 9 or 10 inches x 5 inches).

Bake in middle of oven until golden and crusty, 50 minutes. Unmold and cool on a wire rack.

Sage Breaks Record, Advances to State Meet

The Loudonville High School swim team reached a milestone as sophomore Cooper Sage advanced to the OHSAA state championships following strong performances at the district meet February 20.

Loudonville opened the game with strong momentum, sparked by an early three-pointer from senior Addison Wolford and a two-point basket from senior Abby Eikleberry. The Redbirds controlled the first quarter 16-6 and continued their steady pace into the second, outscoring the Wildcats 8-6 to take a 24-12 lead into halftime. Loudonville added 16 points in the third quarter while Mogadore responded with 13, then closed the game decisively with an 18-5 fourth-quarter surge to secure the win.

Sophomore Jordyn Johnson led Loudonville with an all-around performance, scoring 25 points and shooting 9-for-11 at the free-throw line. She also recorded six rebounds, two assists, two steals and a block. Sophomore Sylvia Spangler followed with 15 points, six rebounds, four assists, four steals and a block. Wolford contributed 10 points along with seven rebounds, three steals and two assists. Eikleberry added three points, seven rebounds, three assists and a block.

Loudonville hosted Smithville Feb. 24 in the next round of tournament play, falling 46-44 in an overtime battle. The opening quarter was tightly contested, with Smithville edging ahead 22-21. Neither team scored in the second quarter, sending the game into halftime with the Redbirds trailing by

Sage earned a fifth-place finish in the 50-yard freestyle with a time of 21.91 seconds, securing a spot in the state field as the 14th seed. He also qualified in the 100-yard freestyle, placing 13th in 48.70 seconds and seeded 25th overall. The swim marked a personal best and set a new Loudonville High School record.

Junior Nicole Rooks also had a strong showing at districts, finishing 10th in the 500-yard freestyle in 5:54.96 and 16th in the 100-yard breaststroke at 1:13.11.

Sage becomes the first Loudonville boys swimmer to reach the state meet, following in the footsteps of his sister, Britney Sage (LHS 2020), who became the school's first girls state qualifier in 2019.

He will be joined at the state meet by coach Brooke Trumpower, who leads the USA club program based at Ontario High School. Trumpower also works with the Ontario High School team, which is sending multiple qualifiers to the state championships.

The state meet began with preliminary races February 26. The top 16 swimmers advanced to Friday's finals, scheduled for February 27. Results were not available at press time.
