Ashland Council Approves Land Purchase for Future Housing

Ashland City Council approved the purchase of a 115-acre parcel of farmland along Mifflin Avenue and King Road for approximately \$2.98 million during its June 16 meeting. Mayor Matt Miller said the property is intended for future single-family residential development and will allow the city to guide growth while helping ensure the project aligns with its long-term planning goals.

An agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation for asphalt overlay and repair work on Interstate 71 near U.S. 250 also received council approval. The project will be completed at no cost to the city.

Routine business included approval of budget transfers, "Then and Now" certificates, and an advertising permit for Andrew Collins of Omni Fiber.

City officials said the alley paving project is underway and is expected to be completed within four to five weeks. An additional 85 residential streets are scheduled to be repaved beginning in July.

Members also recognized the opening of the Ashland Fire Department's new training facility and discussed a recent emergency response drill held at Reagan Elementary School.

Preparations continue for Ashland's celebration of America's 250th birthday in 2026. Miller announced that Todd Kleismit, executive director of America 250-Ohio, is expected to attend the unveiling of the Freedom Park monument on July 4. Miller also encouraged veterans and active-duty service members to register through the city's website to participate in the ceremony. Parking maps for the event will be released at a later date.

Ashland City Council will hold its next regular meeting at 7 p.m. Tuesday, July 7, at the Municipal Building, 206 Claremont Avenue. Meetings are open to the public and livestreamed on YouTube.

Ashland Commissioners Place DD Levy Increase on November Ballot

The Ashland County Commissioners voted Thursday to place a renewal and increase of the Board of Developmental Disabilities levy before voters in the November 3 general election.

The proposal would renew the county's existing three-year 2.10-mill levy and increase it by 1 mill, for a total of 3.10 mills. The levy would fund operations at Dale-Roy School programs and facilities. County Auditor Cindy Funk said the levy would cost \$77 annually for every \$100,000 of property value.

The board authorized execution of a Discount Drug Mart opioid settlement agreement that will provide Ashland County about \$18,988.77 in settlement proceeds.

Commissioners approved a \$97,303 Ohio Department of Transportation grant during a special meeting Monday to rehabilitate airport runway identifier lights. The county's local share is \$5,121.40. The agreement was approved ahead of a June 16 deadline.

The board appointed Abby Donofrio to the Airport Authority for a four-year term beginning July 14.

They also approved a contract with the Local Emergency Planning Committee and the Ashland County Emergency Management Agency to provide disaster coordination services and allow grant funding to be transferred into the county general fund. Commissioner Jim Justice said the change will make the funds easier to track.

The board held a 2027 budget hearing, approved the county's tentative 2027 budget and authorized advertising of the adopted county tax budget for public inspection at the commissioners' office during regular business hours.

Funk said projected 2027 revenue is \$19,014,560, a 2% increase over 2026 driven primarily by county sales tax. Funding requests from county offices total \$22,911,499, up 7.4% from 2026. The largest requested increases were 14% for insurance, 19% for the Clerk of Courts and 8.5% for the Sheriff's Office.

Other actions included approving a personnel appointment within the Department of Job and Family Services and appropriations for expenses in various departments.

Commissioners approved Then and Now certifications and payment of warrants for the Soil and Water Conservation District and canceled its June 23 meeting due to a lack of agenda items.

Craig Butler, executive director of the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District, provided a watershed project update.

The next regular meeting is scheduled for 9 a.m. Thursday, June 25, in the second-floor conference room of the Ashland County Building, 110 Cottage Street. Meetings are open to the public and streamed live on the "Ashland, OH County Government" Facebook page.

Loudonville Receives Nearly \$800K in State Funding

The Village of Loudonville received several funding updates during the June 15 village council meeting, including nearly \$800,000 in state funding for infrastructure and recreation projects.

Village Administrator Garret DeWitt announced the Ohio Public Works Commission will provide \$499,999 toward the village's \$1.1 million Spring Street revitalization project scheduled for later this year. The project includes new sanitary and storm sewers, water lines and paving.

DeWitt also reported the Ohio Department of Transportation has submitted its recommendations for Transportation Alternatives Program grants, with award announcements expected later this month.

In addition, DeWitt said State Representative Melanie Miller (R-Ashland) informed him the village will receive a \$300,000 capital budget grant for the Riverside Park Connector, a bike path improvement linking the Ohio 3 bypass with downtown Loudonville.

Councilman Bill Huffman presented a 2022 letter from ODOT that he said reflects an ongoing disagreement between the agency and the village over the speed limit on Ohio 3.

Huffman said the village's refusal to raise the speed limit from 35 mph to 50 mph east of Byland Animal Hospital has possibly delayed other ODOT projects, including resurfacing of Ohio 3, now expected in 2030 instead of 2028.

Village officials have maintained the existing 35 mph speed limit should remain because of the number of commercial entrances and exits along that section of highway.

Councilman Brandon Biddinger urged caution in the village's dealings with ODOT, noting the agency is considering a Transportation Alternatives Program grant for additional downtown infrastructure improvements.

Council also discussed downtown parking. Huffman advocated developing additional spaces, while DeWitt said the village expects to soon acquire the property at 224 W. Bustle St., where a house will eventually be demolished to create parking. DeWitt said the village has invested about \$190,000 so far in the two Bustle Street parking lots. Mayor Cathy Lance and Councilman Matt Armstrong questioned additional spending, with Armstrong saying, "Spending this much doesn't seem smart."

Councilman Tom Young said council has received numerous complaints about Rumpke's trash collection service and could consider other options if problems continue, although the company's exclusive contract runs through the end of 2027. Lance said Law Director Thom Gilman believes the complaints may stem from training issues involving new employees.

Council members also raised residents' concerns about dust from the village chip-sealing project. DeWitt said the village would address complaints from residents on Wally Road and Vincent Drive.

Council confirmed Josh Buzzard as fire chief and appointed Starla Phillips and Joshua Fogleman as firefighter/EMTs. Huffman also reported the planning and zoning committee is drafting revisions to regulations governing short-term rentals, including Airbnb properties.

The next village council meeting will be held at 6 p.m. Monday, July 6, in council chambers on the second floor of the village office building. The chambers are wheelchair accessible via the second-floor fire escape. Council meetings are open to the public.

Ashland Police Investigate Road Rage Shooting

Ashland police are investigating a road rage incident involving a firearm that occurred June 16 near the intersection of U.S. Route 42 and East Main Street in Ashland at approximately 6:45 a.m., according to a news release.

The release said the incident involved a motorcyclist and a work crew traveling to a job site outside Ashland County. The confrontation escalated at the intersection into a physical altercation between the motorcyclist and an occupant of the truck. During the altercation, a firearm was discharged, but no one was struck.

All individuals involved have been accounted for, and the firearm has been seized, police said. No formal charges have been filed at this time. Ashland Police Chief Curt Dorsey said

the case remains under investigation and will be reviewed for possible charges.

Police said the incident is isolated and there are no safety concerns for the community.

LEMON BLUEBERRY CHICKEN SALAD

Yield: 4 servings

INGREDIENTS

- 1 1/4 cups (10 ounces) lowfat lemon flavored yogurt
- 2 Tablespoons reduced fat mayonnaise
- 2 cups fresh or frozen blueberries
- 2 cups cubed cooked chicken breasts
- 3/4 cup sliced celery (about 3 stalks)
- 1/2 cup thinly sliced green onions (about 6)
- 1/2 cup diced red bell pepper
- Salt to taste
- Freshly ground black pepper to taste

DIRECTIONS

In a medium bowl, combine yogurt and mayonnaise. Mix in blueberries (saving a few for garnish) chicken, celery, green onions and bell pepper. Mix gently.

Add salt and pepper to taste. Cover and refrigerate to let flavors blend for at least 30 minutes.

Serving Idea: Serve over endive or other salad greens with reserved blueberries and lemon slices, if desired.

ORZO SALAD WITH SUMMER ROASTED VEGETABLES

Yield: 8 servings

INGREDIENTS

- 1 small eggplant, peeled & diced
- 1 yellow bell pepper, diced
- 1 red onion, peeled & diced
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/3 cup olive oil
- 1 1/2 teaspoons sea salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 pound orzo
- Dressing:
 - 1/3 cup freshly squeezed lemon juice (about 2 lemons)
 - 1/3 cup olive oil
 - 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
 - 1 tablespoon honey
 - 1 teaspoon sea salt
 - 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- To Finish:
 - 4 scallions, minced (white and green parts)
 - 1/2 cup pine nuts, toasted
 - 4 ounces crumbled goat cheese
 - 10 fresh basil leaves, cut into chiffonade

DIRECTIONS

Preheat the oven to 425 degrees F. Toss the eggplant, bell peppers, onion, and garlic with the olive oil, salt, and pepper on a large baking sheet. Roast until softened, about 25 minutes, but still al dente. Turn vegetables over once with spatula.

Cook the orzo in boiling salted water for 7 to 9 minutes, until tender. Drain and transfer to a large serving bowl.

Dressing: Whisk together the lemon juice, olive oil, Dijon mustard, honey, salt, and pepper.

Once the vegetables are roasted, add to the pasta, scraping all the liquid and seasonings from the roasting pan into the pasta bowl. Then toss with the dressing. Let the pasta and vegetable mixture cool to room temperature. To finish, add the scallions, pine nuts, goat cheese, and basil.

Serve chilled or at room temperature.

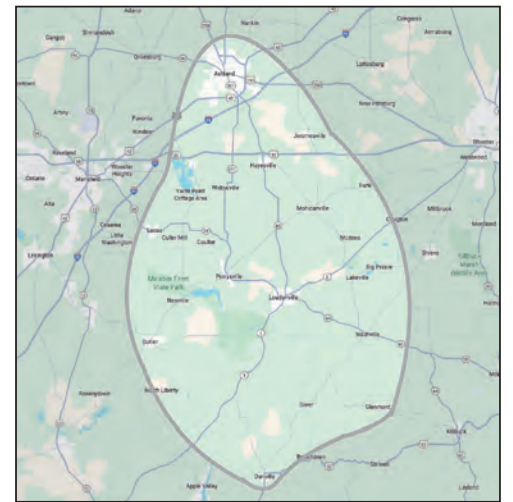

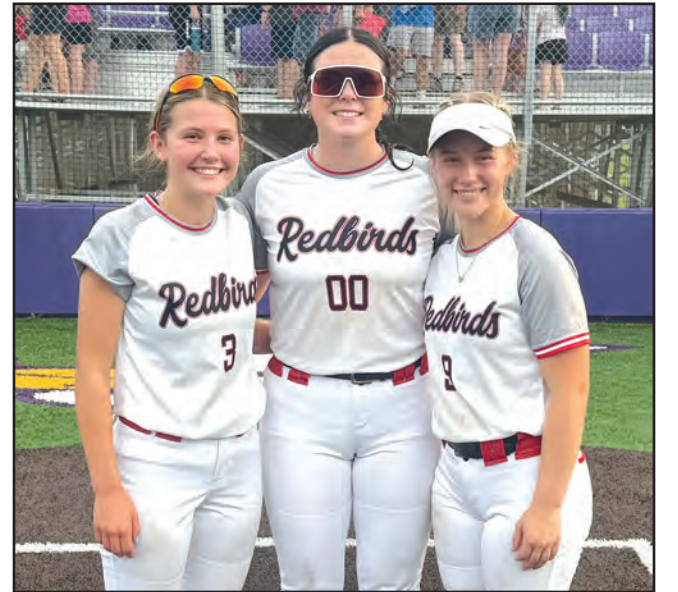
Since the scholarship program began in 1994, the Ashland County Sports Hall of Fame has awarded \$65,500 to 110 area high school students.
