The purpose of breaking Puppies/Beginners is the teaching of and learning of the basic skills expected of a dog by its handler and the instructor.

**Assessment**

At this level the dogs will be introduced to walking on the ground and a basic tunnel. Correct collars and leads to be used. The handler is to establish focus by using the dog's name. Correct socialisation. Dogs will be in this level for about 6-8 weeks. To graduate, the dog must have focus established.

**Puppies 1/Handled**

At this level focus should be more established. The sit should be established. Heel work will be improving with better control. An on-lead recall is introduced. Correct socialisation is continued. The drop command is introduced. To graduate, the dog must have focus established on a drop on command.

**Puppies 2/Graduated**

At this level the dog should have good focus established on a drop. Heel work is continued with a change of direction. A short stay and leave is also introduced. The stand command is taught. Socialisation is continued. On-lead recall is continued. To graduate from this level, the dog must have focus established on a drop on command.

At all levels of Puppies/Beginners we are looking for the dog to be learning knowledge of the basic commands rather than perfect. They do not have to, however, be perfect.

All family members should be encouraged to handle the dog in class.

The length of time a dog will be in any one class will depend on the dog's age, temperament and training schedule. Never judge your dog against another dog.

It is important to have readily available vaccines against diseases such as Parvo virus, distemper, and rabies. Long ago vaccines against Parvo were available. It is up to you as to whether your dog might contract the disease. The luxury of a simple course of vaccination is a life that will help to protect your pet.

Common diseases: Rabbitbiting Parvo, Distemper, and Hepatitis.

Common diseases: Rabbitbiting Parvo, Distemper, Hepatitis, Bordetella (Kennel Cough), and Bordetella Bronchiseptica (Kennel Cough).

At the next vaccination visit, then on following visits, owners choose to continue with the C3 or C4 vaccine as their choice. Keep in mind your dog may not be able to attend training/shows without a valid vaccination certificate.

Parvo virus is a relatively common virus that is a highly contagious virus which infects dogs ONLY in puppies. The signs are usually as loss of appetite, depression, and watery or bloody smelling diarrhoea. On average the virus lasts for 2 weeks and is most often fatal.

What is Parvo? Parvo is a very tough virus and it can last for 2 months or more. The vomit and faeces contain the virus. This means that by simply touching the virus has been in the last 12 months could be on your dog's feet. Because of this your dog could be a carrier of the virus. You could bring the virus home with you.

### **Fun for seniors**

Although they don't have youth on their side, seniors are still fun learning new things. Sultana suggests some fun activities for your senior pet:

1. Nose work/scent detection. Using their sense of smell, so playing a bit of find-and-sniff is a great activity.
2. Obedience. Sit, drop, stay, come, etc. These commands over the years are learned and can be quickly reinforced.
3. Retrieving items. There's nothing wrong with a dog that may be a bit slower than it used to be, but they can still learn.
4. Wave.
5. Rollover.
6. Targeting. This involves teaching a dog to touch a paw or nose. It is so easy to train and can be a great way to keep a senior dog's mind sharp.

### **Important check-up**

If you are having any concerns or doubts about your dog's abilities, Sultana suggests referring to a professional. Your dog may be reluctant to do certain things, but with patience and
