## PARA DISTRICT OBEEDIENCE DOG CLUB INC.

### General Club Rules

1. Dogs are not allowed in Clubrooms.
2. Bitches in season are not allowed on Club grounds.
3. Dogs may not be off lead unless permitted by an Instructor.
4. Dogs & handlers must not use equipment without permission.
5. All incidents of dog attacks (provoked or unprovoked) must be reported immediately to the Head Instructor who will act accordingly. The incident must be recorded in the Incident Report book in the Office. An appeal to the decision made by the Head Instructor may be made in writing to the Club Secretary and the incident discussed at the next Committee meeting.
6. Children under 10 must be supervised by an adult at all times on the Club grounds.
7. If your dog fouls on the Club grounds you must clean up the deposit immediately. Poo bags are provided on the grounds. If your dog urinates on a Club building or structure, you rinse it off with water.
8. Smoking is not permitted in class or in Club buildings.
9. No alcoholic drinks are permitted in class or in Club buildings.
10. If you arrive late, do not enter your class. Wait until the instructor indicates that you may join.
11. Members must wear sensible shoes – no thongs or bare feet.

12. Any member not in class may not exercise their dog in the vicinity of classes in progress.
13. Please keep dogs well apart to avoid confrontations.
14. All handlers and dogs participate at their own risk.
15. A current vaccination certificate must be presented upon joining or attending a complimentary class. It must also be presented when renewing an existing membership.
16. Dogs carrying a contagious disease may not attend until they are cleared in writing by a qualified vet.
17. Abusive or foul language is not tolerated on Club grounds.
18. Your membership badge must be worn in class. "I forgot" badges are available from the office.
19. There will be no training for Obedience if the Saturday night forecast for Sunday is 32°C or over for the Elizabeth area.
20. There will be no training for non-trialers in Agility if the Thursday night forecast for Friday is 32°C + for the Elizabeth area. There will be no training for non-trialers in Agility if the Thursday night forecast for Friday is 32°C + for the Elizabeth area.
21. There will be no training for beginners in Flyball if the Sunday night forecast for Monday is 32°C + for the Elizabeth area.
22. Any class may be cancelled due to stormy or inclement weather at the discretion of the Head Instructor (s).
23. Sun protection is encouraged for you and your dog.
24. All injuries must be reported and recorded.
25. Class instructors in consultation with the discipline Head Instructor, reserve the right to send a dog back to a lower class if it is to the advantage of the dog and/or handler.

dead or alive birds he had caught in the garden. Oh well, I'd made my commitment so we soldiered on. Then Rally O was introduced so that's what we did

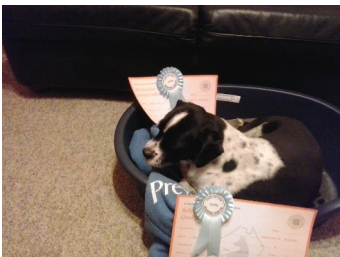

## Summer is approaching!

### **Can dogs get sunburned?**

If you're planning beach trips and outdoor activities with your dogs this summer, make sure to protect them from the harsh UV rays of the sun. Just like humans, canines are susceptible to painful burns and potential skin cancer. Keep your dog safe with these tips.

### **Which dogs get sunburned?**

Some dogs are more susceptible to getting burned by the sun. White dogs, for instance, tend to have fair skin underneath their fur — and a greater potential for sun damage. Dogs with naturally thin hair, and especially the hairless breeds are also at risk for sunburn and skin cancer. All canines, regardless of the thickness of their coats, have vulnerable areas of the body with less fur or none at all. The belly and the ears have delicate skin, and even a dog's nose can become dried out and sore.

### **Watch out for paws on hot roads and paths**

As well as sunburn, hot roads and paths are also something important to consider during summer as paws can get burnt. If it's too hot for your own feet then it's too hot for your dog. Avoid going for walks during the middle of hot days and make sure to test the temperature of the paths you are walking on. Take precautions to walk in the shade or carry your dog if you need to cross hot paths and roads.

## **Prevention**

### **Shade**

Some well-intentioned pet owners shave their dogs in an effort to keep them cool in the summer, but doing so exposes “virgin” skin to the sun. A better cooling tactic is to always provide shade—a big umbrella at the beach, a shady tree at a park, a roof for your backyard patio, or a sun-block top for an outdoor kennel. Your dog will instinctively seek shelter from the sun when the rays become too intense.

Walk your dog early in the morning or later in the evening to avoid the hottest part of the day. Not only will this prevent your dog's skin burning in the sun's hot rays, but paths and roads will be cooler and prevent burns to your pup's delicate paws.

### **Slip-Slop-Slap**

It is important that you use a pet-friendly sunscreen to prevent potential harm caused by licking and ingestion. Our animal hospitals stock effective sunscreens which are formulated especially for dogs. Apply sunblock to the tips of the ears, nose, belly, and groin areas. There are also a number of sun hats available for dogs, however some dogs may not tolerate these and will become distressed.

diagnosis

### **Signs of dog sunburn**

Just like people who get too much sun, dogs also get red skin that is tender to the touch. The most susceptible areas—the nose, ears and tummy—are likely to show overexposure before fur-covered areas. Look for dry, cracked skin and curling at the edges of the ears. Other signs of doggy sunburn are constant scratching in tender places accompanied by a whimper, and shrinking away when you try to pet him/her. If sunburn is severe, your dog may even get a slight fever.

### **treatment**

If you suspect your pet has a sunburn, veterinary care is recommended. Dogs do not burn as easily as people, so more damage has occurred to the skin than you may be able to initially see.

Treatment of sunburn is based on the severity of the burn. After diagnosis and initial treatment, daily treatment with wound cleaning and topical medication may be necessary.

We are now no longer making money, or just breaking even, when we also have to supply judges, stewards and helpers with lunch. Many clubs are no longer doing BBQs, or just doing a sausage sizzle. We have had some new ideas being thrown around in regards to food. I personally believe having food available adds value to our trials, but we still have to make money.

Our Sunday obedience is still going strong with some new ideas being trialled. A couple of these are a beginners trial ring to introduce people to the world of trialling and help them assimilate. We will also be trying training days revolving around things like clicker training, again adding value to our obedience training days.

Agility on a Friday night is still going well with new faces always coming out and enjoying the training. It's a pity that not as many people go on to trial these days.

Flyball also continues to roll along with several teams competing throughout the year and new members always coming along to try out.

Dancing with dogs is still going on a Monday night with its usual stalwarts coming out to train.

I would like to thank all of the volunteers who help to make the club run so smoothly and the committee who work like trojans to keep the club running behind the scenes. Without all of your time and effort you volunteer, the club would not exist!

Thank you to all those who support me as President. It has certainly not been an easy year for my family on a personal level and I hope to keep serving you for the next year.

## **Flyball 2018 Report**

It has been a funny year for flyball this year. We missed a lot of training due to rain and stormy weather, lost a few dogs early in the year to retirement both due to age and injury, and only had a few new dogs start racing as regular members of teams. We also haven't had many new dogs starting so often had more instructors than beginners at training. Having said that however the changes to Open Class racing has meant we have been able to have relatively good stability in teams across the year which has seen our teams performing well in competition with a lot of the final placings coming down to countbacks between teams.

At the time of writing this report we have had 4 competitions for the year with one more still to come on at Dover on November 17. In these competitions our teams have placed as follows:

March Dust Off: 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>

The other was the racing at our October Fair competition which this year was held at the City of Prospect Spring Fair. . It is not very often we get to compete with spectators, so it was a fantastic opportunity for our Club and members to show of the sport. Fingers crossed this will become an annual competition for us.

Just remember that flyball training happens on a Monday night and ANY dog can participate once they are 12 months of age. New dogs are welcome at any time so why not come down and give it a go and hopefully we see you at training in 2019.

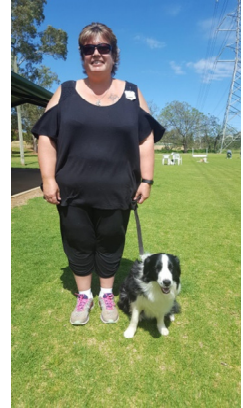

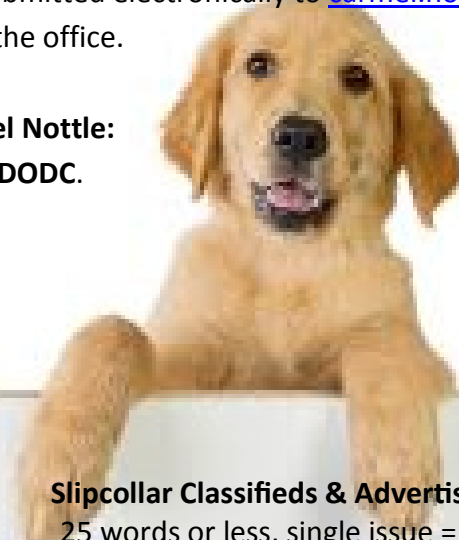

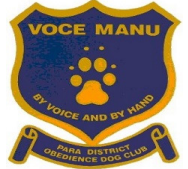
