PARA DISTRICT OBEDIENCE DOG CLUB INC.

General Club Rules:

1. Dogs are not allowed in Clubrooms.
2. Bitches in season are not allowed on Club grounds.
3. Dogs may not be off lead unless permitted by an Instructor.
4. Dogs & handlers must not use equipment without permission.
5. All incidents of dog attacks (provoked or unprovoked) must be reported immediately to the Head Instructor who will act accordingly. The incident must be recorded in the Incident Report book in the Office. An appeal to the decision made by the Head Instructor may be made in writing to the Club Secretary and the incident discussed at the next Committee meeting.
6. Children under 10 must be supervised by an adult at all times on the Club grounds.
7. If your dog fouls on the Club grounds you must clean up the deposit immediately. Poo bags are provided on the grounds. If your dog urinates on a Club building or structure, you rinse it off with water.
8. Smoking is not permitted in class or in Club buildings.
9. No alcoholic drinks are permitted in class or in Club buildings.
10. If you arrive late, do not enter your class. Wait until the instructor indicates that you may join.
11. Members must wear sensible shoes – no thongs or bare feet.
12. Any member not in class may not exercise their dog in the vicinity of classes in progress

13. Please keep dogs well apart to avoid confrontations.
14. All handlers and dogs participate at their own risk.
15. A current vaccination certificate must be presented upon joining or attending a complimentary class. It must also be presented when renewing an existing membership.
16. Dogs carrying a contagious disease may not attend until they are cleared in writing by a qualified vet.
17. Abusive or foul language is not tolerated on Club grounds.
18. Your membership badge must be worn in class. "I forgot" badges are available from the office.
19. There will be no training for Obedience if the Saturday night forecast for Sunday is 32°C or over for the Elizabeth area.
20. There will be no training for non-trialers in Agility if the Thursday night forecast for Friday is 32°C + for the Elizabeth area. There will be no training for non-trialers in Agility if the Thursday night forecast for Friday is 32°C + for the Elizabeth area.
21. There will be no training for beginners in Flyball if the Sunday night forecast for Monday is 32°C + for the Elizabeth area.
22. Any class may be cancelled due to stormy or inclement weather at the discretion of the Head Instructor (s).
23. Sun protection is encouraged for you and your dog.
24. All injuries must be reported and recorded.
25. Class instructors in consultation with the discipline Head Instructor, reserve the right to send a dog back to a lower class if it is to the advantage of the dog and/or handler.

Hi everyone—and welcome to our first edition of the Slipcollar for 2020. We've included the reports as they were submitted back in February as well as graduations as they were at the time. Thank you so much for your understanding and we look forward to bringing you regular copies of the Slipcollar from now on.

President's Report—September 2020

Hi everyone! It's great to see you all back out at training after what has been a very trying start of the year, not just for the club but the whole world in general. I hope everyone is healthy and got through the lockdown with as few problems as possible.

It was sad to see that we had to cancel our trials for the year, but, unfortunately, there were too many difficulties with the restrictions that were in place in regards to social distancing, etc., at the time. Hopefully next year we will be back up and running in regards to our trials. It was a shame as so much work had been done, not only in the organising of the trials, but also in the training of dogs to get them ready for the ring. Oh well, there's always another day.

At the AGM last year I made a mistake in the way we accepted committee members. It was an honest mistake and was not meant with any malice, but it did mean we had broken a rule in our constitution in regards to excess numbers of people sitting on our general committee and the way in which they were accepted. This breach of constitution was brought to our attention at the first meeting of the year and the executive committee made every effort to fix this problem. In our constitution, under 'Proceedings of Committee paragraph (10)', it states:

'All acts or decisions done or made at any meeting of the committee shall, notwithstanding that it may afterwards be discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of any member or all of the members of the committee, be valid and effective as if those members had been properly appointed, unless it be proved that such appointment was made in bad faith or by fraud.'

As President, I accept full responsibility for this mistake. I thought that the more people on committee to help, the better. There was certainly never any bad faith, fraud or profiting involved. At no point has this issue ever been covered up or brushed under the carpet and committee minutes are available for anyone to read, but we are volunteers, not paid office bearers, and this has highlighted the need to reassess our constitution, which has not been amended since 2006.

With COVID-19 we have had to put in place quite a few restrictions in the way that people at the club can work. I hope that everyone is taking note and obeying the directions that we have put in place. They are for the protection of everyone and allow us to continue training, so we appreciate your cooperation.

I would like to welcome new members to the club and see we have good numbers attending particularly obedience and agility. For members that joined at the beginning of the year, it is good to see you back after the closure. Once committee has made a final decision, an announcement will be made in the near future regarding membership fees and the club closure.

Flyball Report—March 2020

Welcome back to all our returning Flyball dogs and handlers. I look forward to an exciting year of Flyball fun.

Firstly I would like to thank Chrissy, Karen, Carmel, and Jess for continuing on as Instructors for this year. I would also like to welcome and thank Julian Stokes for putting his hand up to join our team. Julian has a lot of experience in Flyball as well as instructing and competing in Agility and Obedience. His wealth of general dog knowledge and experience training Flyball dogs will be invaluable for us. Welcome Julian!

For those new to the club who have never heard of Flyball before here's a basic rundown. Flyball is described as drag racing for dogs. It is a team sport consisting of 2 teams of 4 dogs (with up to 2 reserves) and their handlers. These 2 teams race against each other in relay style. The dogs race over 4 jumps in a row, retrieve a ball by triggering a box and then return over the same 4 jumps. The fastest team to complete the sequence correctly wins. Flyball is a fast paced and actioned pack sport that dogs and handlers love. It is a great sport for active dogs that love to play ball, fetch or run and jump in general.

We are always looking for new members so if you think this may be the sport for you and your pooch or if you would just like to see what all the fuss is about come and check us out. Dogs of any breed, size and speed are welcome. We train on Monday nights from 6.30pm. Dogs need to be 12mths old to start training. A grade 3 level of obedience training is helpful but not essential. If you have not reached this level of training yet we can do an assessment of your dog to see if you have the control needed to start training. If not, we will give you a few tips on what to do to help and you can return when your dog is ready. Come along with some treats, your dog's favourite toy and a positive attitude and give it a go!



2019 Wrap Up

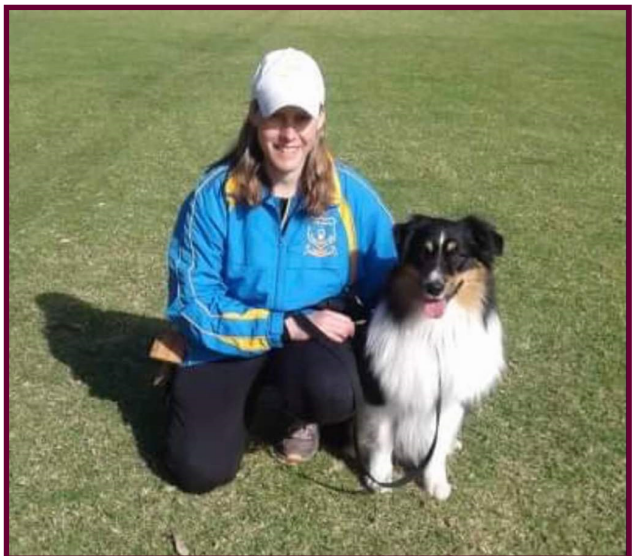

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st OCTOBER 2019

The Achievements of Danni McCulloch

since joining PDODC

I started doing obedience in the late 80's and agility in the early 90's. First with a Shepherd x Corgi, and then a German Shepherd x Doberman, Sheba, that I competed with. I started agility with her when agility competitions started with 2 trials a year, 2 heights and 2 rounds with nobody really knowing what we were doing, apart from touching the contacts with flag people on either end and trying to get one clear round out of 2 rounds with only 8 jumps. Yep and it was still hard to get a qualifying round.

Sheba was a brilliant dog and for someone who didn't know a lot we achieved heaps. Sheba got her Australian Obedience Champion title (to get that you had to get your ud title plus your TDX title and that's your tracking). Her AD title as that was all they had in those days.

I can remember there was a big competition held at Para with clubs coming from all around Australia competing. I was in the composite team, with Michael Vigor, Richard Spurling and somebody Hoare and myself.

Then the following year we did it again and I can remember coming all the way from Happy Valley every Wednesday night and did our training. I had Rambo and he was one tough dog. He got his CDX title and ET and his AD and JD title. Never passed very often but I persisted. I had found this club very helpful and asked if anyone can help me with Rambo and if they can get him going I would stay. Bugger me dead Terry Heney, put his hand up and they worked very well as a team. Yep every Friday night I drove from Happy Valley to training. Talk about being dedicated.

Meanwhile I got another dog, a kelpie called Milo. She came with her own problems. In those days we heeled our dogs around the course and Milo didn't want to do that she wanted to run fast.

Me being a slow runner and Milo a fast dog I had to change my style. Milo was a one pass a year dog so it was a slow haul. Milo after years of training and competing got her AOC(Australian Obedience Champion) plus the new OC(Obedience Champion) ADX and JDX title. We had hit a snag in masters and that we parted company at every trial. I went one way and she went another. I started to hate agility.

I got another dog around than and that was my Coolie Xena. I knew if Xena ended up like Rambo and Milo only passing one trial a year and arguing around the course I was calling quits. In those days you heeled your dog around and she wanted to go fast so me being a slow runner and her a fast dog I had to change my ways and learn how to handle.

Xena ended up being a brilliant dog. Xena got her Agility Champion Dog doing it the hard way needing 10 first passed in both master agility and jumping and the other 10 a first, second or third in both master agility and jumping. Her Obedience Champion and her UDX, she also got all her games title as well plus having the Australian Record for the fastest 60 weavers.

She was also the first dog in Australia to get her OC and AGCH and the first dog to get her UDX title. She won lots in both obedience and agility winning state titles, Royal Shows and classes in both obedience and agility and competed in lots of national agility getting into the finals. We never managed a win at the titles the closest was runner up in quite a few classes. We did manage a win in the team event though. Xena was a very consistent girl in whatever we did.

At that time I basically retired Milo and concentrating on Xena going through the trialling grades. Linda was looking for new agility instructors and I was on the cards. She tried very hard in talking me into it. I didnt want to talk to group of people only one on one. Linda basically said if I wanted help with Xena and her to run Milo I had to instruct. Very persuasive Linda was. Milo loved her agility and I agreed to become an instructor only doing one on one. Once I become confident I started taking a class. All this happened around 20 years ago around 2000.

I ended up getting a border collie Inka for my mum's birthday and she was supposed to be only a pet. One of the conditions from mum was that I was supposed to train her. So I decided if I was going to train her I may as well train her for competitions. Mum was so proud of Inka and her achievements. Inka got her OC .AGCH, and Rally Obedience Champion. Plus her games titles. She's done well winning in both obedience, agility and rally in classes and state champions, plus Royal Shows, and doing well at National levels getting in finals.

For the love of the Coolie breed I got another one Gabby and she was another great dog. The first dog to gain her Grand Obedience Champion also her obedience champion title the old Agility Champion title and her Rally Obedience Champion title. Winning numerous classes in both obedience and agility and rally in state champion as well as Nationals finals. We managed to become a National Master Gambler Champion in Sydney, finally. We also had a crack in dancing with dogs and got our freestyle starter title.

I now have another Coolie that has started her career in both obedience, agility and rally. She has her CDX title and her AD and JD plus her SD and GD titles. Rally she is in masters, and her JC title (junior courser) luring. Mysty has won a few state titles in obedience, agility and rally.

Over the years Xena, Inka and Gabby have won multiple Golden Dumbell awards between them, actually 11 of them. Xena received 7 of them being the only dog to amass that amount of trophies. To gain a dumbell the highest award in the obedience you had to get 13 passes with utility and open at the same trial. My girls are champions to my eyes.

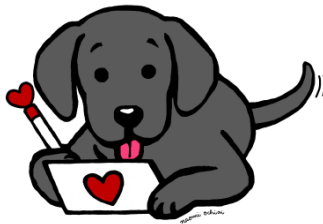
