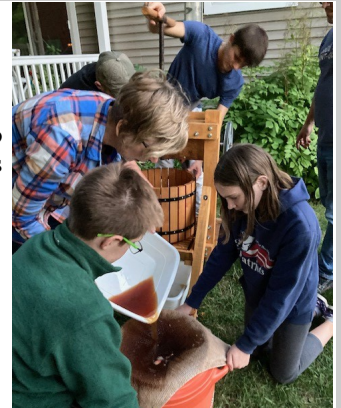

### CHCS Drama Class Work On Vocal Performance

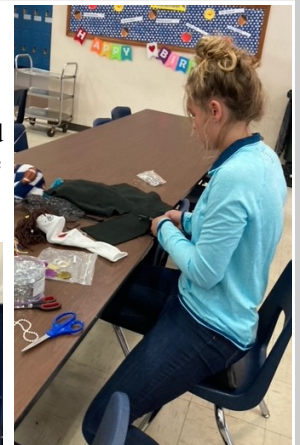

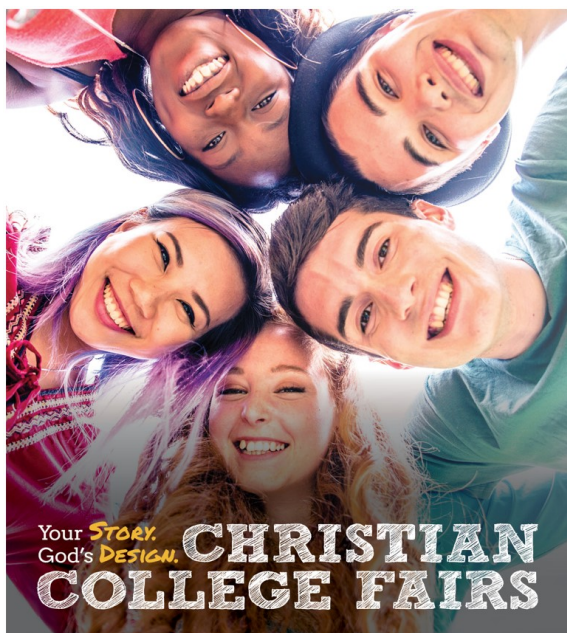

The CHCS boys soccer team came up with it's first win of the season with a 7-1 victory at home over Pineview on Tuesday, September 28.

Pineview came out more aggressively than CHCS during the first half, winning most of the free balls and working in a few fast breaks, but the Patriots defense with junior Peyton Nickel in the net stopped their advances. The Patriots finally

began to put things together, with senior Brady Johnston scoring the first goal unassisted. Junior Mateo Powell scored the next two goals, first assisted by Sebastian Vrieze, followed by an unassisted goal, finishing the half 3-0. In the second half the Patriots got

down to business adding four more unassisted goals from senior Seth Wanner, freshman Sebastian Vrieze, junior Peyton Shaffer, and junior Joe Johnston. Pineview worked in one goal on the night, bringing the final score to 7-1. "We finally turned a corner we have been working toward all season," stated Patriots coach Tom Stagg.

### Lady Patriots Sweep Past Warriors in a 3-0 Win!

The CHCS high school volleyball team tallied another win Tuesday night, September 28 at home. They defeated the Daystar Warriors in three sets (25-23, 25-6, 26-24) to win the match.

Daystar came out strong in the first set, matching the Patriots point for point. The Patriots did not give up and fought to the end, pulling out the 25-23 victory.

Going into set two, the Patriots let the Warriors know they were ready to defend their court.

The Patriots served 100% from the line, led by senior Mackenzie Vrieze and sophomore Malia Husted. Sophomore Regan Farmer added several smart set assists that allowed strong kills from teammates Riley Husted (JR), Madison Salisbury (JR), Kendall Meekhof (JR), and Natalie Vandenberg (SO), to keep the team momentum going. The efficient team effort allowed the Patriots to take the set with an impressive 25-6 win.



The Patriots entered set three confident and took an early lead. Some unforced errors and stamina from Daystar closed the Patriot lead just a few rotations into the game. The Patriots pulled it together with some strong serving and effective hits to stay on top. Two key serving aces from junior Desirae Vrieze secured the Patriots' 26-24 victory.
