Safety Grant Award

Last spring CHCS applied for and received a \$50,000 MSP – Safety Grant! The purpose of this grant is to upgrade the security of the entrances of school buildings in Michigan.

The projects that have been approved for CHCS are:

- 1) Classroom door barricades (completed)
- 2) Two new entrance doors (ordered)
- 3) All school intercom system that will allow schoolwide announcements and alerts as well as communication between individual classrooms and the office (ordered).

We anticipate that #2 & #3 will be completed by early December.

The safety of our students and staff is a priority at CHCS and we are very thankful that these funds have been made available to improve the security of our facility.

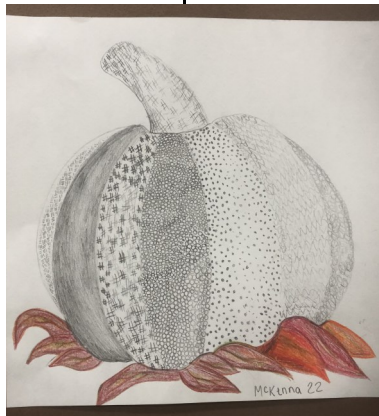
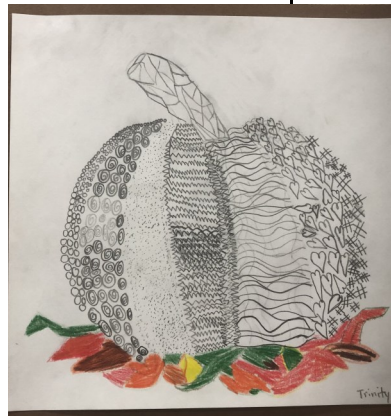

Soccer Drop a Pair of Heartbreakers

CHCS hosted Skeels on Thursday, September 22, in a soccer match that ended in a 3-1 win for Skeels. Both teams came out fighting, taking shots at each end of the field during the first half. Senior Peyton Shaffer scored an unassisted goal, and Skeels also scored tying the game at the half 1-1. The battle continued in the second half with both teams shooting on the net, but Skeels hit the back of the net twice, while the Patriots were shut down.



Keeper Peyton Nickel had six saves for the Patriots. Coach Stagg was proud of his team, “Both teams played hard tonight. The keepers had some tremendous saves, and Skeels earned the victory. Our entire team played well, experienced and younger players alike. We also kept our attitudes in check. So for me, that was a successful game!” The loss Thursday evens up the Patriots’ record at 3-3-1 for the season.

The Patriots traveled to Traverse City on Tuesday, September 27, to take on the Bulldogs in a soccer match that went to TCBAAs 3-1. The weather played into the game with wet and slippery conditions, and a lightning sighting that abruptly ended the game in the second half. CHCS got out to an early lead on an unassisted goal by sophomore Sebastian Vrieze. TCBAAs answered back with a goal of their own, ending the half in a 1-1 tie.

Both teams battled back and forth in the second half, each taking several shots on goal, but TCBAAs got the upper hand and scored two more goals. With just under thirteen minutes left in the game, lightning was sighted, ending the game with the Bulldogs in the lead 3-1.

Keeper Peyton Nickel had seven saves in the net. Coach Stagg commented on the game, “History seemed to repeat itself tonight, as Sebastian Vrieze also scored the lone goal against TCBAAs earlier this season, ending in a 1-3 loss. What I am impressed with, is the level of play that our team demonstrated tonight once again, as well as the great sportsmanship that both teams displayed despite the weather conditions. Players were constantly slipping and going down all through the game, and they just laughed it off and kept on playing. We appreciate teams like TCBAAs that play hard and fair and have great attitudes!”

The loss tonight takes the Patriots’ record to 3-4-1. They travel to Big Rapids on Friday, September 30 to take on Crossroads Charter Academy for a late 7:00 p.m. game.
