


A Beautiful Afternoon For Hoops and Loops!



Soccer Earns Impressive Win Under The Lights, Drops One On The Road By Coach Tom Stagg

The CHCS Patriots played under the lights in Big Rapids on Friday, September 30, defeating Crossroads 7-1. Heritage controlled the game, keeping the ball on Crossroad's end most of the time. Junior Aiden Shepardson led the Patriots' charge, scoring the first two goals off from assists by Sebastian Vrieze and Seth Wanner. Sophomore Sebastian Vrieze followed up with an unassisted goal, finishing the first half with CHCS in the lead 3-0. In the second half Crossroads scored a goal, but couldn't hold the Patriots back. CHCS added four more unassisted goals, two by Sebastian Vrieze, and one each from senior Seth Wanner and senior fullback Joe Johnston. Keeper Peyton Nickel played forward in the second half, while seventh grader Josiah Salisbury put on the keeper gloves. The keepers had one save each on the night. Coach Stagg was impressed with the team, "We played well as a team, young and experienced players alike. Several had opportunities for shots on goal, and demonstrated great sportsmanship! It was also a special night as Crossroad's superintendent of 24 years retired tonight, and stepped in as honorary coach for their team." The win evened the Patriots' record at 4-4-1.

CHCS traveled to Pentwater in soccer action on Tuesday, October 4, losing 2-6. Pentwater controlled the game in the first half, scoring three goals and shutting down the Patriots' offense, ending the half with a 3-0 lead. The Patriots answered back in the second half, scoring a goal by sophomore Sebastian Vrieze off an assist from Seth Wanner, and on a penalty kick taken by senior Seth Wanner. Pentwater continued their offensive prowess, scoring three more goals in the second half, winning the game 6-2.

Keeper Peyton Nickel had 4 saves for the Patriots. Coach Stagg commented, "We were wrapped up in Pentwater's game in the first half, simply reacting and not playing our game. In the second half we played better, controlling the ball, and attacking their goal with confidence. Pentwater has some great players, so we left it all on the field tonight!"

The loss tonight lowers the Patriots record to 4-5-1 for the season. The Patriots will travel to Harbor Springs on Friday, October 7, where they will take on Harbor Light Christian School.

In the first game, the Patriots started a little slow, but quickly gained momentum. Strong serving by the entire team helped the Patriots gain the lead and quick reactions on the defense helped them keep it. The Patriots took the game one win, 25-18. In the second set, the Bulldogs game out strong and took an early lead, that is until Senior Kendall Meekhof headed to the serving line. Kendall racked up 5 aces and two more serves for points, bringing the Patriots back on top. Senior middle hitter Madison Salisbury and sophomore setter Regan Farmer
