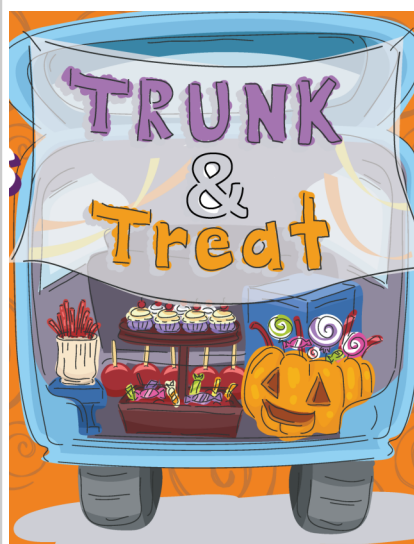

### Varsity Volleyball Tops Suttons Bay and Marion in Two Tough Matches

Cadillac Heritage Christian travelled to Suttons Bay for varsity volleyball action on Thursday, October 13, edging out the Norsemen in a back-and-forth battle, 5-25, 25-20, 18-25, 25-21, 15-13. The Patriots started out sluggish, but regrouped and made a great comeback. "The girls played outstanding tonight," CHCS coach Heidi Salisbury said. "It was a battle at every serve, but the girls worked hard. It was an amazing game."



The seniors were strong at the net; middle hitter Madison Salisbury posted 8 kills, 1 block, and 2 aces, outside hitter Riley Husted racked up 7 kills and middle hitter Kendall Meekhof had 5 kills, 1 block, and 3 aces. Junior setter Regan Farmer contributed 11 assists and 3 aces, while junior setter Malia Husted added 9 assists. Junior outside hitter Natalie Vandenberg added 5 kills and sophomore Katie Shaffer ended the fifth game with a perfectly placed return to secure the match for the Patriots.

On Tuesday, October 18, CHCS hosted Marion in front of a full home crowd in varsity volleyball action. The Patriots topped the Eagles in four games, 23-25, 27-25, 25-21, 25-18. The Patriots were slow to get into their groove, and ended up dropping a close first game. In game two, the Patriots took an early lead, but had to fight to maintain it, taking the game to extra points for the win. Heritage Christian was able to maintain the momentum and took the next two games for the match victory.

Senior middle hitter Kendall Meekhof racked up 8 kills, 1 block, and 4 aces, while senior middle hitter Madison Salisbury added 2 kills, 7 aces, and 1 block. Senior outside hitter Riley Husted added 5 kills and 2 aces.



Junior setter Regan Farmer was strong with 14 assists, 6 aces, and 2 kills, while junior setter Malia Husted contributed 7 assists and 2 aces. Junior outside hitter Natalie Vandenberg ended the night with 5 kills and 3 aces.

The two wins improved the Patriots' record to 13-2 overall. They will be back in action on Tuesday, October 25 when they travel to Boyne Falls, and again on Friday, October 28 when they close out their season with a home match at 6:00 p.m.
