CHCS COVID Protocol

If your student has any of the following symptoms, please keep them home until they are feeling better:

- Temperature of 100.4 or signs of fever (chills/sweating)
- Sore throat
- New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing
- Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain
- New onset of severe headache
- Fatigue

Students may return to school when they have been fever free for 3 days without the aid of fever reducing medication, and when any other symptoms have improved.

*Positive COVID test - Student

If your student has tested positive for COVID, they need to be out of school for 10 days from onset of first symptoms.

Siblings in the same household need to be out of school for 10 days from last exposure to the person who tested positive, and may return if they have been symptom free for those 10 days. If they develop symptoms, it is recommended that they be tested for COVID.

*Positive COVID test - Parent

If a parent has tested positive for COVID, the students in the family need to be out of school for 10 days from last exposure to the parent, and may return if they have been symptom free for those 10 days. If the student develops symptoms, it is recommended that they be tested for COVID.

Exception

If a person has been vaccinated or has had COVID in the past 90 days, quarantine is not needed.

Notification

If a student is reported to have a positive COVID test, the school will notify the parents of the affected classroom and the parents may make the decision to quarantine or not.

*COVID testing and COVID vaccinations are not required by CHCS
