General Requirements for all Animals

Exhibitors at state, county and district fairs, along other livestock exhibitors, exposition and shows are required to comply with all of the statutory and regulatory p4rovisions of the State of Michigan relating to animal health outlined in the Animal Industry Act, 1988PA46MCL 287.701-287.747, and rules promulgated for the implementation and enforcement of the act.

- A person who discovers, suspects or has reason to believe that an animal is either affected by a reportable disease or contaminated with a toxic substance shall immediately report the fact, suspicion or belief to the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (Daytime phone: 800-292-3939; after hours 517-373-0440).
- Livestock with clinical signs of infectious, contagious or toxicological disease shall be removed from the fair, exhibition, exposition or show authority or by permission of the directorm shall be isolated on the premises.
- 3. A fair shall have an accredited veterinarian on call whenever there are animals on the premises during the fair.
- 4. All cattle, sheep, goats, swine and privatelyowned cervids shall bear official USDA identification before they leave their home premises. Swine require official identification prior to being exhibited.
- 5. Upon request, a person who exhibits livestock shall present for inspections all reports, test charts and appropriate health certificates require to accompany the livestock.
- **6.** A fair, exhibition, exposition or show authority shall do all of the following:
 - Notify exhibitor of health tests and certificates required for importation and exhibition.
 - Examine and approve required official animal identification, health certificates, reports, test charts, certificates or other required documentations before commingling with other animals.
 - Notify exhibitors whether or not poultry vaccinated against infectious
 Laryngotracheitis (ILT) are allowed in the fair, exhibition, exposition or show.
 - d. Providing shipping arrangements for all swine exhibited that are to be removed from the fair, exhibition, exposition or show facility for direct movement to slaughter or a livestock auction market

- as defined in Licensing Livestock Dealers, 1937PA287. 121.287.131.
- 7. A fair, exhibition, exposition or show authority may require additional testing or vaccination of animals before entry and during the fair. Exhibition, exposition or show authority.
- 8. Whenever an official test is conduction or an official vaccination is administered, livestock shall, unless exempted by the director, be permanently identified in a manner approved by the director.
- 9. Unless otherwise approved by the director, a facility for exhibition of livestock shall be constructed to allow sufficient separation of each exhibitor's livestock. The Facility shall be constructed of a material that can be adequately cleaned and disinfected.
- 10. An exhibition building or yarding facility shall be cleaned and disinfected with a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) approved disinfectant used in accordance with label instructions before livestock are admitted by removing from the premises all manure, litter, hay, straw and forage from pens, runways and show rings; and thoroughly disinfecting walls, partitions, floors, manger, awarding facilities and runway in a manner approved by the director. General Requirements for out of State/Visitor Animals

- Out of state livestock for exhibition shall meet the requirements prescribed for importation of animals of that species and shall be accompanied by a copy of an official Interstate health certificate or an official interstate certificate veterinary inspection by an accredited veterinarian from the state of origin.
- 2. Livestock shall not be directed to a premise other than the destination site named on the official interstate health certificate.
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that all requirements for testing, identification and official interstate health certificate or official interstate certificate of veterinary inspection or fulfilled prior to the importation and that proof of fulfilling these requirements is provided to the director, fair, exhibition, exposition or show authority upon request,
- 4. If vesticular stomatitis outbreaks have occurred in the state or origin within the past 12 months, the following statement must be including by the accredited veterinarian on any official interstate health certificate or official certificate of

veterinary inspection for importance of Equidae, into Michigan:

"I have examined the animals listed on this certificate and have found no clinical signs of vesticular stomatitis. To the best of my knowledge, these animals have not been exposed to vesticular stomatitis with in the previous 30 days, not have they been vaccinated with vesticular stomatitis vaccine." FREE ADMISION TO THE GROUNDS

PARKING: All public parking will enter fairgrounds from Blevins Street Entrance. NO PARKING will be allowed on the midway and area surrounding barns and buildings at any time. South M-66 Entrance is for Exhibitors & Deliveries ONLY, North M-66 Entrance Campground use ONLY. All exhibitors will park in Public Parking off Blevins Street Entrance.

Parking Fees: (per day) \$5.00

(per week) \$10.00

Market Animals will receive 2 parking passes per family. Additional passes need to be purchased.

Camping Fees: (per week) \$40.00

RULES AND REGULATIONS SECTION 1 – GENERAL RULES

1. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED. NO PHONE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

Pre-Entry must be completed on-line.

- Exhibitors and their families that do not show respect or courtesy at all times to fellow exhibitors, spectators, judges, superintendents, and fair officials shall be subject to lose all fair privileges including disbarment from the fair and any fair functions at the discretion of the Marion Farm Exhibit Association.
- Exhibit Building entry tags must contact Superintendent. Exhibitors needing buyers passes need to contact fair office. Livestock exhibitors needing parking passes will be handed out by Superintendent (exhibitors will receive two (2) parking passes per family, additional passes must be purchased).
- 4. All open class exhibitors must reside in the following counties: Osceola, Lake, Wexford, Missaukee, Clare and Mecosta.
- 5. The management will not be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any animal exhibited or for any article of any kind/nature that may be lost or destroyed, or damaged in any way. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person by any animal, owned or exhibited by him/her, or arise

- from any negligence of the person in charge of such exhibit.
- Any ample police force will be kept on the ground's day and night and every effort will be made for the security of exhibitors and others in attendance, but the Association WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY LOSS OR DAMAGE that may occur.
- The Board of Directors reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions or differences in regard thereto.
- The management reserve to itself the sole and absolute right to settle disputes and misunderstanding arising out of premiums awards or any phase of enterprise of the Fair without claim for damages.
- 9. The management reserves the right to reject any exhibits deemed unworthy.
- 10. Each division of the fair will have in charge one or more superintendents, who with such assistant or clear as may be needed, will have the management of such departments. Superintendents of all departments exhibiting for them will be furnished with judging sheets in the department and receive such instructions as may be necessary. These sheets must be returned to the treasurer with the finding of the judge's property recorded thereon. The superintendent and judge must sign each sheet on which premiums are awarded.
- 11. No exhibitor or any persons shall at any time, without the permission of the fair board, lead or ride their animals from the barns to any place on the fair grounds where they may endanger pedestrians. Any infractions of this rule shall forfeit all premiums and shall be sufficient cause to have animals removed from the fair grounds.
- Exhibitors must be in good standing with the Association to participate or exhibit in Association sponsored events. The Board of Directors determines condition on good standings.
- 13. "YOUR COMFORT, YOUR ENJOYMENT AND YOUR INTEREST WILL BE GUARDED AND PROTECTED TO THE LIMITE OF OUR ABILITY".
- 14. NO ALCHOLIC BEVERAGES ALLOWED ON THE FAIR GROUNDS OR CAMPGROUNDS.
- 15. SEE SPECIAL RULES UNDER EACH DEPARTMENT, ASLO SEE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITED IN MICHIGAN.
- 16. **NO OUT OF STATE ENTRIES** unless approved by Fair Board.

- 17. Where there is but one exhibitor in a class, the animal or article may be awarded first, second or none at all as the judge may deem worthy.
- 18. NO MORE THAN ONE ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED FROM ANY ONE EXHIBITOR IN ANY ONE CLASS, UNLESS DEPARTMENT RULES SPECITY DIFFERENTLY. Champion ribbons will not be awarded in livestock classes unless exhibits arrant it.
- 19. Any person using deception in entering animal or article shall be disbarred from exhibiting.
- 20. Exhibitors will provide their own hay, grain & bedding. All stalls must be cleaned after animals leave the fairgrounds.
- 21. Exhibitors having questions at to placings should check with the Department Super indent as soon as Department is judged. All claims to be in writing by the close of the Fair.
- 22. Exhibitors refusing or failing to exhibit livestock when so ordered by Superintendent in charge shall forfeit all fees at the directions of the Superintendent.
- 23. Youth Horses will enter Saturday of the fair and will be released as soon as they are done showing. Horses must be pre-registered.
- 24. All exhibitors will be awarded ribbons in all department based on placings as designated.
- 25. Current RFID tags must be met on dairy and beef cattle. Animals will not be unloaded without these papers. All sheep and goats must have scrapie tags before unloaded. All horses must have coggins test before unloading.
- 26. All animals must be properly dehorned. If due to breed standards, they cannot be, then owner must provide protective fencing that is acceptable to the superintendent so the animal can not reach the public.
- 27. All pens MUST be cleaned on Sunday after fair, starting at 8:00 am. Failure to do this will result in a \$40.00 penalty. Arrangements must be made with appropriate superintendent if you can not abide by this. Must be at barns at 8:00 am to start. Pens need to be cleaned between 8:00 am and 10:00 am.
- 28. RELEASE TIMES FOR ALL EXHIBITS: Large & Small Animal Breeding Stock, Still Exhibits Saturday 9:00 pm. Market Animals Large & Small Sunday 8:00 am 10:00 am. Horses after show on Saturday.
- 29. 10% commission fcc on all items selling through the sale.

 - d. Fine Arts
 - e. Canned Goods
 - f. Needlecraft
- 3. The person must be a blue-ribbon winner in three categories.
- 4. Person must have 25 or more points to be eligible. Person must receive highest total point count for the present year to win. Points will be awarded as follows:

a. 1st place Blue Ribbon 3 points b. 2nd Place Red Ribbon 2 points

c. 3rd Place White Ribbon 1 point

- 5. Winner MUST participate in the Old Fashion Days Parade in Marion.
- 6. Persons wanting to compete in the Homemaker of the Year competition must register for this by using the class number listed below.
- 7. Participants can win every other year, but must show prior year to wind third time.

RULES FOR YOUTH EXHIBITORS AND MARKET LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:

- 1. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED.
- 2. ALL ENTRIIES MUST BE MADE ON-LINE.
- Exhibit building tags and buyers passes need to contact Fair Office. Livestock exhibitors parking passes will be handed out by superintendents (exhibitors will receive two parking passes per family, additional passes must be purchased).
- 4. Exhibitors must be between 6 and 19 years old (ages as of 1/1 of the current year).
- 5. All exhibits in Exhibit Building, must be properly tagged with official fair tag.
- 6. Exhibitors and their families that do not show respect and courtesy at all times to fellow exhibitors, spectators, judges, superintendents, and fair officials shall be subject to lose all fair privileges including disbarment from the fair and any fair functions at the discretion of the Marion Farm Exhibit Association.
- RELEASE TIMES FOR ALL EXHIBITS: Large & Small Animal Breeding Stock, Still Exhibits – Saturday 9 p.m.: Market Animals Large & Small Sunday 8 am – 10 am.
- 8. Youth members who exhibit at the fair must be in possession of and feed thereafter until the animal is released on Sunday.
- 9. Where there is but one exhibitor in a class, the animal or article may be awarded first, second or none at all as the judge may deem worthy.
- 10. NO MORE THAN ONE ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED FROM ANY ONE EXHIBITOR IN ANY ONE CLASS UNLESS DEPT. RULES SPECIFY DIFFERENTLY. Champion ribbons will not be awarded in livestock classes unless exhibits warrant it.
- 11. Tamper and/or misrepresentation as to breeding, age, ownership or unethical fittings and any other irregularity in showing will be considered fraud and deception. Any trophies, awards or sale money won by exhibitor will be withheld.
- 12. EXHIBITORS WILL PROVIDE THEIR OWN HAY, GRAIN & BEDDING. ALL STALLS MUST BE CLEANED AFTER NAIMALS HAVE BEEN RELEASED.
- Exhibitors having questions as to placings should check with the Department Superintendent as soon as Department is

- judged. All claims to be in writing by the closed of the Fair.
- 14. Exhibitors refusing or failing to exhibit livestock when so ordered by the Superintendent in charge shall forfeit all fees at the directions of the Superintendent.
- 15. Judge may disregard any entry as unworthy of premium.
- Current RFID tags in ears must be met on dairy and beef cattle. Animals will not be unloaded without these papers.
- 17. Scrapie requirements must be met on sheep and goats. Animals will not be unloaded without scrapie tags.
- 18. If, in the opinion of the judge, the exhibit does not merit an "A" grouping rating, the judge has the privilege of starting with the ribbon or rating he/she decides upon.,
- Any person or animal under the influence or alcohol and/or drugs will not be allowed to participate at the fair. Projects will be removed from exhibit and premiums forfeited.
- 20. All exhibitors are limited to one exhibit in any class unless otherwise stated.
- 21. No animal may be shown by more than one exhibitor.
- 22. Each exhibitor must personally show and sell his or her own livestock.
- 23. Primary responsibility for grooming animals for show is that of the exhibitor. (Parents or other youth may assist)
- 24. Youth exhibitors must dress appropriately on show day and sale night-clean pants, shirt and clean leather boots or shoes, club/logo t-shirts are permissible. No open-toed shoes or tank tops allowed. NO mid DIVISIONs shall be exposed. These guidelines cover both large and small animals' participants.
- 25. Any conflicts in the Youth Division will be handled by the Species Superintendent. If unresolved it will be taken to the Livestock committee, and if still unresolved it will go before the Fair Board. It's the intent of the Fair Board to deal in a timely manner on all conflicts at the time of the incident.
- 26. Where there is no competition for champion, the making of these awards will be left to the discretion of the judge, depending upon the worthiness of the exhibit.
- 27. Pens are to be bedded with natural material (wood shavings, straw, etc.)
- 28. Water must be available to all livestock.
- 29. Barns and stalls must be cleaned by exhibitor by 9 a.m. each day and throughout the day as needed.
- 30. Humane handling practices of livestock at all times.

- 31. Youth exhibitors including market and breeding stock must be in possession, defined as "having custody, ownership, primary care and responsibility" of their animals by weigh in dates for market and May 1st for breeding animals. The Marion Fair believes a young person learns best by daily, active involvement with their project.
- 32. Animals shown in Youth Division MAY NOT be the same ones shown in Open Division.
- 33. SEE SPECIAL RULES UNDER EACH DEPARTMENT. ALSO SEE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITED IN MICHIGAN.
- 34. The Marion Farm Exhibit Livestock Auction is open to youth members only who meet the following requirements.
 - Enrolled with a County Youth Club by December 1st of the current year that is recognized by the extension office.
 - Reside in the following counties:
 Osceola, Lake, Wexford, Missaukee,
 Clare, Isabella or Mecosta County.
- 35. An individual animal may be weighed-in by more than one immediate family member but can be shown by only one (1) family member.
