

## DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE



**From the M1 (South) :** Leave at Junction 35A and follow the signs to Manchester.

**From the M1 (North) :** Leave at Junction 36 and follow A61 to Sheffield.

At the "Macdonalds" roundabout, continue onto the A61 (Sheffield and Grenoside). Follow the A61 for approximately 3 miles to the Norfolk Arms Pub on the left.

**From the M6 :** follow the M56 onto the M60 then the M57, follow signs for Sheffield. Follow the A57 onto the A628 then A616.

In the Stocksbridge area, take the sliproad for Wortley / Sheffield, and the A629. At the junction, turn right onto the A629. Follow the road to the next junction (Jet Garage). Turn right onto the A61.

**From the Jet Garage,** follow the A61 approximately 1 mile to the Norfolk Arms Pub on your left.

**Turn right** immediately opposite the Norfolk Arms Pub.

Continue up Norfolk Hill for 200 yards to the "Give Way" sign.

**Turn Left** into Main Street, Grenoside.

**The venue is on the Left after 200 yards.**

### **Judge's Profile**

Hi, I would like to start by saying huge thanks to the committee for the invitation to judge your beautiful breed at this show, I feel very honoured. Just a small introduction to my background. I was brought up from the age of 4 in a house full of dogs, mainly Afghan hounds, there has always been Afghans in my life interspersed with cocker spaniels, Chinese Shar Pei, a wonderful Japanese Akita, show greyhounds and racing greyhounds, (which were my dads passion) salukis's and most recently a sloughi has joined the clan. I think my sister and myself learnt a lot about hound movement and structure from being brought up between dog shows and the racing track !.

I first fell in love with Borzoi's as a child, my mothers friend showed Afghans and Borzois so I spent many a day in the company of them and we travelled to shows with her, so I used to share the back of the car with them. I have attended breed seminars and I have watched them with great interest at shows, over the last 40+ years there has been quite a few that have made my heart skip a beat and love it when you see a youngster that excites you, and you see it go on to a successful career in the ring ! As a family we have had, what I consider a comfortable 'career' in the showring, considering that it was never a full time commitment due to the fact we also had horses that I showed and evented.

Hounds have always been a great love though and I pride myself on always looking for a hound that is as close to the breed standard and as fit for purpose as possible, yes, the glamourous, full coated dog may look beautiful to some, but I find the beauty in a dog that is fit, structurally correct and that could do the job that it was bred to do. A coat can be grown, a clever groomer can primp and preen but correct structure and movement has to be paramount. I have shown since I was 7 years old and had my first judging appointment 34 years ago and still find every appointment enjoyable and fun yet still take them all very seriously and professionally.

I give CC's in Afghan hounds and take pride in that 3 of appointments have been received on the balloted system which I hope reflects that I judge with honesty and integrity.

I could most probably ramble on for ever about dogs, and animals in general, but I will stop there.

#### DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in members' classes or competing for members' specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. 19th January 2019

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) **Withdrawal** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) **Transfer**

(a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class or a Puppy class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class or the Junior Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no Puppy Class or Junior Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

<u>Puppy:</u>	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show
<u>Junior:</u>	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show
<u>Graduate</u>	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
<u>Post Graduate</u>	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed
<u>Limit:</u>	For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed
<u>Open:</u>	For all dogs of the breed s for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.
<u>Veteran:</u>	For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the show
<u>Special</u>	Neither exhibit, exhibitor nor handler to have won a Challenge Certificate in the breed
<u>Beginners</u>	For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of the same breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.
<u>Brace</u>	Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.
<u>Not For Competition</u>	

#### RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 10.00 a.m..
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.30 a.m..
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The entry fees will be - Members £4.50 first entry per dog, Non-Members £5.50 first entry per dog. Subsequent entries (same dog) £1.50 any number of classes. Not for competition £1.00
6. The amount of prize money on offer at this show is £10.00 – BIS, RBIS & BPIS, £1.00 for 1st in each class
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show**  
Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
11. **Best in Show**  
Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

## **RULES & REGULATIONS** (continued)

12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS  
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
  - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
  - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
  - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
  - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
  - Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
  - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

17. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered or Not for Competition:
18. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
19. No entries will be accepted without fees
20. All dogs must be registered or transferred at the Kennel Club before the closing date for entries
21. In all cases the decision of the judge is final, except where fraud, misrepresentation or any breach of rules is discovered, or a bona-fide mistake is made by the judge
22. Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling his appointment, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another in his place. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned
23. The Committee reserve to themselves the right on reasonable grounds to refuse any entry they may think fit to exclude or remove any dog not in a fit state for exhibition from disease, vice or any other cause.
24. Exhibitors passes will not be sent. If receipt of entry is required please enclose a S.A.E. with your entries

25. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any property entrusted to it, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and any other persons that the Committee will not be held responsible for the loss or damage to any dog or other property whether arising from accident or any other cause, nor from any act or omission of themselves, their Officers, Servants, Agents or others and it is on this understanding that entries are accepted
26. No animal other than a dog duly entered at the Show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance
27. Any objection to a dog must be made under the terms of K.C. Reg 28
28. Any instructions in the nature of Rules and Regulations printed for convenience in other parts of this schedule shall be deemed to be the Show Regulations of the Committee and shall have the same effect as if they formed part of these regulations.
29. In the regrettable event that this Show has to be cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the Northern Borzoi Association do not undertake to refund any fees paid

The Committee of the show can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition

## **Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F (Annex B)**

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
  - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulation will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at
  - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42
2. a) No substance, which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat, may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance, which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog, may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.  
b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition
3. No act or operation which alters the natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
  - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
  - b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed
  - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered would be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. Any individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
