Pastor's Corner! November 16, 2025

We are in the midst of the Catholic Charities 2025 Appeal to support the needy. The various Offices of the CC {Catholic Charities} do great work in extending the compassion of Our Lord to thousands of people in need throughout the Five County area. One of those Offices is the Office for Nutritional Development Services, which oversees the many groups within CC's responsibilities. NDS oversees the collection of food. clothing, and other essential supplies for babies and new mothers. The *Lord's* Pantry, hosted by St. John the Baptist Parish in Ottsville, is one of those sites that represent the Archdiocese; they do an outstanding job of caring for the needy in our area. Last week, the AOP's Office of Nutritional Development Services sent a letter to all pastors, appealing for help from their parishes. Because of the Government shutdown, virtually all food banks across the area and the County are down to 50% of the food that they would ordinarily have on hand to face the winter needs of the needy. This is a crisis! In light of this request, it was time for St. Lawrence Parish to establish something I had been tossing around in my mind: a parish group dedicated to collecting throughout the year food and supplies for those in need. Recently, two women of our parish stepped up to the plate to organize such an effort. They are Marion Sampaio and Maureen O' Brien. I am so grateful for their enthusiasm and the

generosity of their time and talent. Initially, we had planned to launch a food drive after the New Year, when we would have had time to plan. However, the urgency in that letter from *NDS* has forced us to recalculate our timeline.

Consequently, we plan to conduct a Food Drive next weekend, November 22nd and 23rd. This would avoid the Thanksgiving Weekend, when many are traveling and away from Riegelsville. You will find a list of suggested dried and canned foods inserted in this bulletin. Additional copies will also be available in the church vestibule. Similar info will be found on the Parish website. You will also receive an eblast later in the week as a friendly reminder. For those of you who intend to bring a donation, please place it outside the Baby Room. As I write this Pastor's Corner, there is speculation that the Government shutdown is about to end. Regardless of whether it is or not, the destructive effects of the shutdown will persist for a long while, and I ask you to be as generous as you can. As I mentioned, we haven't had a chance to sit down quietly and establish long-term plans or strategy, but you can be certain we will host such drives with some regularity. I ask you to be ready to contribute to those who often live week to week, sometimes day to day, in need. Please remember them in your daily prayers.
