

AOP's Strategic Planning for the Future: St. Lawrence Parish Session

In the light of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia's (AOP) effort to plan for the Church's future, the Archdiocese is consulting everyone who will be affected by this great effort and who can contribute to its success. Beginning on January 5, 2025 with the Archbishop's Pastoral Letter, the focus has been on the Laity and gaining feedback from them. The first important effort was participating in the Disciple Maker Index which ran from Ash Wednesday (2/16/25) until Palm Sunday (4/13/25). The next important opportunity for Catholics of the Archdiocese to contribute to the process are the **Parish Sessions**. These sessions are intended as an information tool, whereby, parishioners have the opportunity to express their vision of Church, their concerns and their hopes. This is also an opportunity for the AOP to explain its vision of the Church for the future; the what's and why's behind it; the developing plan on how they see it engaging all Catholics of our Archdiocese, and finally, to report on the current state of the process. St. Lawrence's first Parish Session will be Tuesday evening, May 27th (6:30 PM- 8:30 PM) in Ceader Hall.

This Parish Session will be led by Brenner LeCompte of the *Catholic Leadership Institute* (CLI). The CLI is responsible for the leadership of the AOP's *Strategic Planning*. I am very grateful to Brenner and the CLI for their effort to travel all the way up to Riegelsville in order that the people of St. Lawrence Parish have an opportunity to participate in this process as informed Catholics of Upper Bucks County. I cannot impress upon you the importance of this opportunity.

I am optimistic for the future of St. Lawrence Parish; however, being a small parish, we do not have a lot of cards to play with; we need to take advantage of every opportunity available to us, to make positive impressions upon all involved in the decision process of the Church of Buck County's future. I also believe, that a session like this will help people who are anxious about the future of the Church and the future of the Church in Riegelsville.

This process started about 2 years ago, and it is only now, that it is beginning to gain traction. To a certain extent, the Church of Philadelphia is writing the book on this process. This is the reason why they are consulting with everyone and seek to get this right.

A final note: It will be helpful to those participating in this Parish Session, if you <u>read</u> and <u>reflect</u> on Archbishop Perez's Pastoral letter *An Invitation from Archbishop Perez*. There are copies in the vestibule of the church. You can also find it on our Parish website: **saint-Lawrence-church.org** (click on the *Strategic Plan box*), and on the AOP's website archphila.org (scroll down to the box an *Invitation from Archbishop Perez*). While visiting that particular site, you might find the additional commentaries, plus a variety of 2-minute videos informative.

Becoming a Catholic!

It was only 4 weeks ago, when hundreds of Catechumens and Catechist throughout the United States were received into the Catholic Church during the celebration of the *Easter Vigil* within their new spiritual family. Here at St. Lawrence, we were blessed by one such gift. If you are a person or know of a person, who has expressed an interest in becoming a Catholic, encourage them to look into what is involved. No one should make a big decision without acquiring as much information as possible. The name of the process is RCIA

{Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults}. There are information sheets on St. Lawrence's RCIA program in the carousel in the vestibule of the church. They can also check out the parish website {saint-lawrence-church.org} which offers similar information. The best way to acquire information about RCIA is to contact Fr. Benn, where the two of them can sit down and discuss what is involved. Some quick info: The process takes about 9 months; we start in September, usually the week after Labor Day. We meet once a week for an hour; you don't have to be a theologian; we presume you are a blank page, so we keep it simple; there are no tests! If at any point in this journey a person feels they want to step back from the program, they are welcomed; we want them to feel comfortable throughout the preparation process. Because there is a lot of material to cover, it is important that candidates start "at the beginning"; acceptance of new Candidates closes September 28th. At this moment, specific details of the program have not been ironed out, but should be by July.

Finally, during these summer months, every Candidates should pray...... talk to God and ask Him for the guidance you need.
