Pastor's Corner! July 11, 2021

In today's 1st reading {Book of the Prophet Amos} and in the Gospel, we hear stories of *sending*. Amos is a person called by God to do something he feels totally unqualified for and totally out of place. Amos is a shepherd; he's an uneducated man; he has absolutely no training in theology, and worst of all, he is from the Southern Kingdom of Juda. Yet, God calls this man who has no credentials to confront the people of the Northern Kingdom of Israel with their unfaithfulness. That is like asking a non-sport person from Dallas to travel to Philadelphia and lecture Eagles fans on why their team "are losers". Trust me, the leaders & people of the Israel {Northern Kingdom} didn't just Boooo Amos after he spoke to them. I am sure that before Amos got through the front door of his home as he began his journey, he was convinced that this was a very bad and doomed idea. Yet, because Amos is a man of deep faith, he is faithful to God's request.

In today's Gospel, we hear how "Jesus summons the Twelve and began to send them out two by two, giving them authority over unclean spirits." In the background of these stories is the reality that there are people in the world who are receptive to God, and flawed as they might be, do their best to be faithful to Him. Then, there are other peoples who drift away from God or flat out reject Him. Not discouraged by their unfaithfulness, God perseveres in reaching out to them through their peers. Some respond to these gestures of love from God and turn back to Him; others, regrettably, reject Him. It is one of the basic cycles in life which will conclude when we reach life's final stage, Eternity. It is important that we notice in these stories, that God employs mankind to assist Him in gathering His scattered sheep. He uses both the laity and in the case of the Apostles, the future clergy. All are called to share in the responsibility of gathering the sheep into one flock. On the surface, neither Amos nor the Twelve appear qualified for this task. Nevertheless, in the spirit of last week's *Parable of the Mustard Seed*, we see that credentials are not an issue for God. What is critical for God is that Amos, Peter, James, John, et al have the love of God in their hearts. For God, their knowledge of theology or the level of their education is so much Mustard Seed. It is important that we not miss God's message to you and me in these readings. Each of us have a responsibility to invite those in

our lives to turn to God; to recognize that He has been inviting them into a relationship with Him. Sometimes that takes the form of an *invitation* such as the Twelve exercised; sometimes it takes the form of humble *correction* as we see in the Prophet Amos. I suspect that, like Amos, most of us feel ill-equipped, unworthy or even hypocritical accepting God's request. It might sound harsh, but the fact of the matter is that in God's mind that's not good enough. In God's wisdom, He sees some of His children self-destructing, and He knows that they might change if only their peers speak for Him. So, my sisters and brothers, let us always keep this responsibility in mind when family, friends or even our Countrymen need to be challenged to be honest about themselves, their priorities and their choices. Like Amos, we must always ask God for the wisdom of what to say, the courage to speak it, the faith to trust that he will protect our hearts as we go about his work inviting the spiritually wounded among us to allow Him access to their hearts. You might find it unnerving, but as sure as God made cicadas, He has also *sent* you into the lives and hearts of the people in your life.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Does the scene of the disciples being sent out two by two bring to mind any other scripture? After the flood, Noah opens the door of the ark and sends his passengers out to renew the face of the earth. Certainly, Jesus has the same purpose. The purpose is fulfilled in your communion in the Body of Christ today, and in your being sent from the Eucharist into the world. The sending is so important that our word "Mass" derives from it. In Latin, the last words of worship are *Ite, missa est*, which means "Go, you are sent." From that, people began to call Catholic worship the missa, or in English, the "Mass." Our English words dismissal, missal, emissary, and mission are all related. We are not sent into the workaday world alone, but in relationship to one another.

Some people have acquired the unhappy habit of leaving worship as soon as they receive Communion and therefore miss the prayer, the dismissal, and the solemn blessing that are essential parts of the Mass. The dismissal is a seal on our Communion and reveals its purpose. Thanks be to God!
