## Pastor's Corner! July 26, 2020

In today's Gospel, Our Lord uses two analogies intended to help his followers understand their relationship with God. I'd like to focus on the first analogy; namely, the unknown treasure hidden in the field. Notice this treasure is hidden. For a long time, no one knew of it. Even if they did know of it, they didn't know where to find it. Obviously, Our Lord is challenging his listeners with the question of who and what do we treasure, and what are we willing to do to acquire and keep that treasure. How often do we allow ourselves to become distracted by things or issues, which in hind-sight, reveals to us, that they were not important to our welfare or happiness as we thought? Our Lord challenges his listeners to reevaluate their priorities. Wealth, status, power are not what will bring a person true happiness, lasting happiness. Only living a life focused on God and living in the Spirit of God's love will bring us eternal happiness. Being a patient person, a generous person, a forgiving person; a selfless person, a person who speaks out against things that are wrong and for things that are right; a person who insists on justice and who will defend the innocent; a person who chooses not to slander the people in their lives.....these are the treasures which God offers us. These are treasures, which he promises us, will bring us his Peace. Unfortunately, these are ways of life that don't shine. Upon first glance, they don't sparkle and they don't catch our eye. Because of that, many people don't take them seriously or see any value in them. Like a field which they might be driving by; all they see is dirt and weeds.

What about you? What do you treasure? What are you willing to give up to acquire that treasure? To keep that treasure? To live that treasure?



Picnics are a sign of the welcome table of God: always room for one more, always plenty to share, always a place of laughter and story-telling and always speaking to us of our deepest longings.
