Pastor's Corner! November 21, 2021

Is it possible that we are trading summer's heat, humidity and smell of the ocean, for November's cool temps, dancing leaves and smell of pumpkin? As important as the summer is for our rejuvenation, the autumn has a value all its own. On *All Saints Day*, we recall all of those who strove to live lives grounded in holiness. *All Soul's Day* sets the tone for the rest of November, when in our belief in the Father's promise of eternal happiness with Him, we make a special effort to stay connected with our deceased loved ones. And then there is what we will celebrate this week, *Thanksgiving Day*! If there is a National Holiday that comes close to being a National Holy Day, *Thanksgiving* is it! All of us know that the spirit of this holiday originated with the Pilgrims & Native Americans shortly after they arrived in the New World. This was celebrated spontaneously for two centuries, until 1893 when President Abraham Lincoln officially declared it a National Holiday. At the risk of being simplistic, it took 3 basic things to bring this about: [1] the horrendous carnage of the Battle of Gettysburg where tens of thousands of Americans inflicted over 50,000 casualties on each other. The Northern forces lost 28% of their army; the Southern forces lost 38% of their army. [2] The close call of almost losing the Union. [3] The religious faith of President Lincoln to recognize, that as Nation, we need to stop and reflect on all that God has given us, both as a Nation and as individuals. Going to church that day was never mandated, but many Americans went spontaneously. Over the centuries, many traditions have been added to this celebration; however, two have never been lost: gathering as a family around food & drink, and gathering with those of our spiritual family to give *thanks* to God for his blessings to us as individuals, to our loved ones and to our Country. We are not the author of our blessings; God is! Only those humble enough to acknowledge this and who live with the same Spirit of Generosity with which God loves us will know Peace.

As we begin this week of *Thanksgiving*, I encourage you, my brothers & sisters, to make time to be alone with Our Lord; reflect on all that you have in your life {your health, your safety, your Faith, the heart of those who see in you what God sees in you and treasures it}. Thank Him for those blessings, those extensions of His love to you. Ask Him to help you to never forget His love. Ask Him to help you have the courage to be as generous for others as He has been generous for you. I'd also

encourage you to consider taking 30-40 minutes to come the 8 AM Mass on Thanksgiving Day to thank Him through your celebration of the Eucharist. Know that I give Thanks to the Father for the gift of the people of St. Lawrence Parish in my life.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Despite the fact that the feast of Christ the King was established less than a century ago, it has already undergone a shift in focus. When Pope Pius XI established this feast in 1925, nationalism and fascism were on the rise. The pope intended that it be a "vehicle for spiritual teaching," one that would recognize the ultimate authority of Christ over all political and social scheming. The last Sunday of October was chosen as the date for the feast because of its proximity to the feast of All Saints, those men and women who bore witness to Christ's reign in so many different ways.

The calendar reforms of 1969 moved the feast to the last Sunday of the liturgical year. There, in the context of November's focus on the end times, Christ's second coming at the end of all time is highlighted. The threefold cycle of readings also expands our imaginations in regard to this feast. In this year's Gospel, Christ stands before Pilate, whose own power blinds him to the truth of the Lord's kingdom. In a world where oppression still holds sway over too many people, this feast is somehow still as timely as when Pope Pius XI first established it.




