Pastor's Corner! September 20, 2020

None of us think of God as a Used Car Salesman. Nevertheless, in listening to his Word to mankind through men like the Prophet Isaiah or the Gospel writer St. Matthew, you can't help but feel that some of the things that God tells us are "a bit of a stretch"; that the spiritual vehicle he is trying to sell us is too good to be true. This is particularly true when it comes to God's capacity to love us in the form of patience, and especially in the form of forgiveness. Recall the parable shared in last week's Gospel, in which Our Lord spoke of a very wealthy landowner who caught his most trusted servant embezzling a "huge" amount of his wealth. The servant had no way of making restitution. The Master forgave him of the entire debt. Most people would see that master as foolish; that his love was reckless. In today's 1st Reading, we hear the Prophet Isaiah appealing to the wayward people of Israel to turn back to their God from their unfaithful ways. The Israelites felt that there was no way that God could forgive them their sins, because their sins were so many and so serious. It was inconceivable for them to believe that anyone could be that generous. What is God's response to his people? "*For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are my ways your ways says the Lord. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts.*" Reflect on the parable in today's Gospel. The owner of the vineyard hires laborers throughout the day, even until the final hour of the day. He pays everyone the same pay. When the landowner pays the workers, who worked only one hour, the same pay as those who worked the long, hard, hot hours of the entire day, they criticize him for his generosity. They don't understand the depth of his love, because his love is not their love, his capacity to love is above their capacity to love. This is the point that our Lord is making with us. God's love for us is wonderful; it is reckless; it is too good to be true. We need not to understand it; we need only to be grateful for it; to never waste it and **most especially of all, to never withhold it from those in need.**

So, my sisters & brothers, there is much for you and me to reflect on. Are we aware of all the ways in which God has loved us and continues to love us? If we are, it will show in what we do with that love. It will show in how patient, tolerant, forgiving, respectful and unselfish we are willing to be when we encounter those in need of them. Can the same thing be said of us as a Country? We who pride ourselves on being the *Land of the Free*; a place of great bounty, a place of great opportunities,

a place where everyone is equal.....What have we done with those freedoms? Are all welcomed to those freedoms? What have we done with that bounty? Do we make sure that everyone has a fair opportunity to have access to that bounty? Do we protect the Environment? How welcoming are we to those who come to our Country; people who are willing not only to benefit from those opportunities, but also who are willing to contribute to its wonderful opportunities? Can we say that everyone is treated equally? Or, are we reluctant to lose some of our *opportunities* at the risk of losing or sharing them with others? These can be unpleasant questions to be asked and answered. Yet, are we not the beneficiaries of God's reckless Love? Are we to complain because we may have worked the entire day, bore the heat of the sun and begrudge others the opportunity to be loved? Each day, when we pray, let us ask our loving God to help us to be as generous as he is, with each person who comes into our life. Regardless of how brief or long it may take; how prepared or unprepared we may be, let us ask him to never begrudge any person or people his love.


