Pastor's Corner! September 26, 2021

For me, one of the blessings of the Jewish Scriptures, known to us as the Old Testament, is that we see how people have not changed much in 3,000 + years. In today's readings, we witness human nature's continual struggle to draw closer to God; it is also our struggle. Unlike the characters in many of our Sabbath readings, where there is some person or group who resists the spirit of God's love, that is not so in today's readings. All of the characters in today's reading are good people, people who are trying to draw closer to God, be faithful to God and who are trying their best to invite others to be in good relationship with God. Unfortunately, in their sincere efforts to be faithful to God, they unwittingly fail to recognize someone who might not be on the same theological page as they are, but certainly striving to be on the same spiritual page as they are. Joshua complains to Moses that Eldad & Medad should be silenced because they are *prophesizing* in the camp because they had not joined the other Elders at the base of the mountain when God shared a portion of His Holy Spirit with them. They ignored the fact that what Eldad & Medad are speaking about is the Holy Spirit's truth to the people. They also fail to understand that the Holy Spirit is not going to be restricted to operate in one strict way or through one avenue.

In today's Gospel, we see the Apostles fall into the same trap. Someone, not of their company or with Jesus' approval is "driving out demons in your name". Like the Elders who came to Moses to complain about Eldad & Medad, the Apostles come to Jesus to complain about this unidentified exorcist. This becomes another moment in the spiritual formation of the Apostles as they learn the deeper implications of being a *disciple*. Notice Our Lord defends the unidentified exorcist because he is performing an act of love; he seeks to liberate someone suffering from some form of evil by invoking the name and goodness of Jesus; he counters evil with the goodness of Christ, not himself. All of this is that person's effort to offer "*a cup of water*" to another who is badly in need of it. Notice, too, who Our Lord identifies as evil and as deserving of being disciplined. "*Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea.*" It is the person who leads people away from the teachings of Our Lord and His Gospel of Love who are the true threats and who should be treated that way. The Apostles fail to recognize that the unidentified exorcist leads people to Christ.

This is a very important gospel for each of us to hear and reflect on. It is tragic that many in our society have embraced a spirit of intolerance to anyone over any issue that does not agree with their view on the numerous hot button issues of our times, and they are quite proud of themselves regardless of how destructive their beliefs are. Certainly, there are times and issues in which Our Lord calls us to stand against true evil, even at the cost of our lives, but those issues should be judged in the light of what he calls us to stand for, and those will always be able to be identified by His call to Love: to be selfless, to forgive, to stand-up for the powerless, to share with those in want or who are unwanted, to own our own sinfulness. When we understand our relationship with Our Lord in those terms, then identifying those who are *good guys* and those who are the *bad guys* will become not only easier, but also easier to stand with.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Did you ever notice how often the angels are referred to during Mass? We commonly meet them in the Confiteor ("I ask blessed Mary, every virgin, all the angels and saints"), prefaces ("with angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven"), the Roman Canon ("we pray that your angel may take this sacrifice"), and Eucharistic Prayer IV ("countless hosts of angels stand before you to do your will"). Last week and this week angels abound as we celebrated Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael yesterday and will honor the Guardian Angels on October 2.

September 29 was originally the feast day for Michael alone. Gabriel and Raphael joined him in the 1969 reform of the Church calendar. The celebration of the Guardian Angels has been observed since the sixteenth century in Spain. Pope Clement X assigned the feast to the first free day after St. Michael's in 1670, and there it has remained. Take some time this week to reflect on these, God's messengers and our protectors, and maybe even celebrate with a little angel food cake!


