

Pastor's Corner! February 2, 2025

Brothers and sisters! Today, the Church wishes to recall the day when, as proud parents and devout Jews, Joseph & Mary brought the Baby Jesus into the Temple for the first time in His earthly life to fulfill the traditions in Judaism, which called for parents to dedicate their firstborn sons to God. A sign of that dedication would be the circumcision of that child. In a complimentary way, it was a sign of Joseph's & Mary's beliefs that their child was a gift to them and a gift to them as a religious people. It recalled the incredible generosity of God to the Jewish people when he liberated them from slavery and *gifted* them with the Promised Land. Their response was to give that gift back to the Father symbolically. At their best, Israel was always aware of God's deep love for them and of their responsibility to love back deeply. Would this not be the theme of everything Our Lord would preach about, teach about, insist on, and embody in His adult life? God created us in Love, forgave us out of Love, and intends to return for us out of Love. What is the connection between this Feast of the Presentation and the blessing of a candle? The short answer is that this is what and why the

Father sent the Son. The Son would become the light of the *World; His teaching,* reinforced by the examples of His compassion, would be the Light that the peoples of the world needed to find their way out of the spiritual darkness that our *World* promotes and perpetuates. This is why the first trip to the Temple is so important. From that Temple and Israel, Jesus would spread the Truth....the Good News! The words of the elders, Simeon and the Prophetess Anna, would only compliment the significance of this day in the life of the Holy Family.

On the day of our baptism, our mothers & fathers, grandparents, aunts & uncles, cousins, friends of our family, and the members of the spiritual family of our parish gathered around our parents, who were so proud and happy for us, as well as for our extended family. Like Joseph and Mary, they also brought their children into church and dedicated them to God. They might not have understood the subtleties of the theology of Baptism, but they wanted their child to be in a relationship with the Father by somehow being in a relationship with His Son. Like Joseph & Mary, they were determined to dedicate their lives to inspiring their

daughter and son to trust the Father's Son, Jesus.

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is more than just going down Memory Lane. It is the Church's effort to play the role of Simeon and the Prophetess Anna by reminding us that, like Jesus, we were baptized for a purpose, namely, to be "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."
