Pastor's Corner! August 18, 2024

I'm sure many of you have heard someone, who, is so in love with another person, remark that, "I love her-him!" " *I can't get enough of him-her*!" These are not the words of someone who is infatuated with another person. These are the words someone who is deadserious and unapologetic in their declaration. These are the words of someone who has discovered the essential goodness of another person. and who now realizes that that person recognizes and treasure their essential goodness. It is a very liberating moment in their relationship. It is the consequence of finding someone with whom you not only share so much, but a person who also has come to know all your flaws, all your faults; yet, who also knows that they will always be incomplete if that person is not an essential part of their life. Only the goodness of the other will give value to their life; only their life can give meaning to the life of the other. They are at Peace, and they are at Peace because no matter whatever else which is important to them in Life, it is insignificant compared to the bond they now share. There is only one source of such a love, and that is God. He loves each of us so much that He came

among us in the person of Our Lord. We need only to listen to Jesus' words and reflect on His life to realize that "He can't get enough of us" either. Such love is not only mystery; it is spiritual.

The words of Our Lord in today's Gospel, might seem like a strange way of "I love you"....."I can't get saving enough of you" but they are. They are His way of saying what it takes to be in such love with Him. The analogy he relies on is that of eating, specifically, of ingesting. If it is true that we are what we eat, i.e. ingest, then Jesus is teaching his listeners, that if you want to be in eternal relationship with the Father, you and I must take Him into ourselves... we must ingest Him. How often have we heard a mother or father remark about their new child that "I could just eat her-him alive." "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me."

My brothers and sisters, over the centuries, many people have struggled to become comfortable with this section of St. John's Gospel, and it is understandable. We tend to take the written word, literally. To the careless,

Our Lord's words suggest the revulsion of cannibalism. But, when Our Lord spoke them, he knew that His audience heard them against the background of His countless acts of compassion, healing, reconciling. All these acts were life-giving and never selfish. So, for those who feel that Christianity in general, and Catholicism in particular are extreme, they are right. They are extreme, because the love of the Father for us is extreme. and he makes no apologies for it. Patiently, He waits for us to discover Him and His love. When that happens, He knows, that we will discover who completes us; who makes us whole; who is our only source of Peace and who gives meaning to our life. Right now, in this world, there are only four basic ways in which we can encounter Him, and **all** of them must be used: 1) His Sacred Word [Scriptures]; 2) in the shared faith of each other [Community]; 3) in our willingness to risk loving others [Charity]; 4) in the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist [both celebrated and lived], along with the Sacrament of Reconciliation]. No matter how challenging these might be for each of us, it is important that we enter them with confidence, that somewhere along our life-long journey, the joyful experience of encountering Our Lord will happen, and when that does, we'll know that "*I just can't get enough of Him*".
