Pastor's Corner! August 25, 2024

In today's Scripture Readings, we see something that most Christians find unpleasant, and to a fault, try to avoid; namely confrontation. One is always hoping that a painless solution can be arrived at, or that the party who has been compromising or flat-out wrong, will own their wrong. Often, it does not turn out that way. When all the alternative solutions have been exhausted and the destructive "one's" refuse to own their behavior, they must be confronted and given their options. In the First Reading, after leading the Israelites through many years of hardships while working their way to the Promised Land, and leading them through many desperate battles in the process of taking over the land from the Canaanites, Joshua speaks to the people, before they journey to the specific sections of the Promised Land which each of the twelve tribes were given. By this time, Joshua is very old. Like a good parent, he reminds them how often and in how many ways God was faithful to them. God was faithful to His Covenant to them. Now that Peace and Prosperity are within their grasp, Joshua challenges them not to suffer from a short memory and to be faithful to their God. God was faithful to them during their bad times; they need to be faithful to Him during their good times. The Israelites haven't done anything wrong, but Joshua understands human nature and that they will now be

without his strong leadership and must become mature in their relationship with God. And so, He challenges them directly with the choice we hear. It must have been frightening for Joshua to do this, because he loved them and always wanted to be on good terms with them; however, being faithful to the Covenant they made with God was more important than anything else. We see how they responded.

In the Gospel, Our Lord has been gradually speaking of Himself more frequently in terms that infer He is the Son of God. This is very risky, because He knows this could be misunderstood as blasphemy. Until this point in His public life, He has cultivated the people's trust. When He speaks more boldly in terms of the mystery of the Eucharist, of eating his body and drinking His blood, He knows that people will become uncomfortable with it; nevertheless, it is the Truth. "For this reason, I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father......As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him."

My brothers and sisters, we live in such times and in such a culture. As the Master's disciples, we too must make choices between being faithful to Our Lord and his teachings, or give in to the pressure of family members, friends and our Countrymen who are uncomfortable with those Truths. Let us stay close to Our Lord in prayer, in the His

Word, in the Eucharist and in the shared Faith of each other, so that we can be faithful to Our Lord. Your brother in Christ,
