Pastor's Corner! July 14, 2024

Today's Gospel is one that I suspect most of us can identify with, and with some level of joy for the "Twelve," take satisfaction. Our Lord is sending the Apostles out on their own for the first time. Until now, they have been staying by Our Lord's side, learning by listening and watching Him, and especially by learning through their many discussions about everything he did and said during their end-of-the-day get-togethers. Now, He has indicated His confidence in them by entrusting His message with them...unsupervised! For the Apostles, it must have been a day of great pride in themselves. Like puppies, they were anxious to please their Master and proud to be identified with Him. Nevertheless, before sending them off, He impresses upon them that as important as their preaching and healing will be, the most important item that should be in their spiritual toolbox is their absolute faith in the Father. They are about the Father's work, which is caring for His children. Being on a mission is not about themselves or worrying about people's perception of them because of the Father's message or their creature comforts while on the road. Trust in the

Father! The sign to the people of their trust in the Father is that they are to travel light and rely exclusively on the Father. "He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick, no food, no sack, no money in the belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic." This is all very impressive and inspiring, but it is also very risky. This is exactly the point that Jesus wants to make for them. The people won't be convinced of their message about their Father's love for them if they don't see the Apostles taking the same risk. They must be ready to empty themselves out for everyone, regardless of whether it is appreciated, misunderstood, celebrated, or betrayed. Out of love for the people whom they will minister, they must be ready to love them. Our Lord is telling them that you cannot preach what you do not live.

So, my sisters and brothers, let us always keep the Lord's call-in front of us. You might not be a theologian, and you might not see yourself doing well in convincing people to move toward Christ with your responses but do not underestimate the power of God's love if it is in you. Be genuine, be honest, and be humble about your Faith. And those around you will pick up on that and be

inspired by it. On the surface, the people in our lives might not be possessed by Satan, but they might be dealing with evil. They might not have a deadly disease, but their spirit might be dealing with exhausting fatigue or prolonged issues at home, within the family, or at work. These are the people that Our Lord sends us out to, bringing to them His presence in order that He might make them whole and heal their hearts and their spirits. Our Lord will never be able to do this through us unless we stay close to Him in daily prayer, through our celebration of the Eucharist, plus our acknowledgment of our own need for healing by putting ourselves regularly in His presence through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Remember! You can't give what you don't have! You can't preach what you don't live!
