Pastor's Corner! July 7, 2024

This weekend should be a time of celebration within our Country, yet the message of all three of this weekend's Scripture readings is sobering. Nevertheless, the examples of the Prophet Ezekiel, St. Paul, and Our Lord are exactly what we need to hear for those who love their Country. Who of us likes challenging or criticizing someone we love? Who of us are attracted to the risk of being misunderstood by those we love? All three men [Ezekiel, Paul, and Jesus] love their people and are proud of the country's traditions and spiritual history. Yet, all three recognized that their countrymen were compromising their relationship with God to the point that it was destructive to themselves and to their spiritual community. They recognized that many of their people had become dishonest with God about their relationship with Him and expected God to cooperate with their lies. On the surface, everything looked kosher, but within, they had become seriously dysfunctional. Ezekiel, Paul, and Our Lord knew that out of love, they needed to confront them, and it would cost them. Naturally, one would immediately think that I am referencing the upcoming Presidential Election in November, and I am. However, I am also referencing every elected position regardless of its place in government: Federal level, State level, and Local level. Both major parties accuse each other of "weaponizing" the elections to

achieve their political goals. The American people deserve better than that. All these issues are resolvable, but only if there are honorable and morally centered leaders within all levels of Government: Federal, State, and Local. Those leaders, both presently in place and those who aspire to serve our Country in Elected Civil Service, need both our direction, correction, and our support.

During this week, when we celebrate the birth of our Country and all that the Founding Fathers tried to anticipate as they composed our *Declaration of Independence* and the Constitution (with its division of powers between the three branches of government). Each day, between now and Election Day, I encourage each of you to take a moment to pray; specifically, pray for three things. #1 Pray for every woman and man who presently serves us on the Federal, State, County, and local levels. Civil Service is an honorable and challenging calling. It asks a lot of those who represent us. It requires a variety of talents; however, the most important gift of all is character. #2 Pray for all candidates who will be running for Office. Pray that each day, they seek the guidance and strength of God's Holy Spirit to always do what is best for us, regardless of whether their decisions are understood and appreciated or misunderstood. #3 Pray for yourself as a voter that you use this precious

gift to do what is best for our Country and for our Countrymen.

I don't know about you, but as dark as these days have been and as pessimistic as many are about our Country's future, I am convinced that there will be more than enough conscientious Americans who will elect the kind of selfless leaders our Countrymen need, but only when they look to God's Holy Spirit to guide them. There are many democratically governed nations in the world, and they make their version of democracy work. However, there is not one of them that still doesn't marvel at America. For all its shortcomings and sins, it still is the template for all democratic nations and the envy of all those peoples who are not neither a Democrat nor a Republican or an Independent; He is a Father who, close to 250 years ago, gave the world children who look to Him to guide them and who continue to make The Great Experiment work permitted to govern themselves. God is. Your brother in Christ.
