Pastor's Corner! May 4, 2025

"Feed"..... "Feed"..... "Follow" Like many of the Gospel stories, especially the Resurrection and post-Resurrection stories, there is much packed into today's Gospel for us to reflect on. We would be right to presume the overwhelming Joy and sense of Victory over Evil that the Father achieves in the Resurrection of His Son. Jov and a sense of victory will strengthen as the days and years pass. The young Church comes to appreciate the significance of what God has done and how God has loved Mankind through the Son's life, teaching, and His outrageous act of Love because of His faith in the Father's love. Yet, today's Gospel also reminds us that being in covenant with the God of Abraham is not a "gimmie." Instead, it is a process that each of us, as children of the Father, must labor at. It is not so difficult for us to see ourselves in today's Gospel as it is painful. The pre-Pentecost Apostles needed to be reminded that the love relationship they enjoyed with the Master was not a one-way relationship. Instead, they [including each of us] are responsible for God's heart, as much as he has shown His commitment to be responsible for each of their hearts. So, what is happening here? Jesus is making them wait. This is not vengeance on Our Lord's part; He is giving them a "Time Out." Just as parents need to give a recalcitrant child a chance to reflect on their disruptive, hurtful, or selfish behavior, with a trip upstairs to their room, so do the Apostles and the other followers of the Lord. I believe that this is why the Israelites spent 40 Years wandering around in the isolation of the Desert before God would guide them into the Promised Land. During that time, the Israelites repeatedly complained about their life, repeatedly doubted God's

love, and repeatedly were ungrateful for what God was doing for them each day of their "wandering." They quickly forgot that he saved them from slavery in Egypt, saved them from the Egyptian Army, provided food and water for them each day, help them when they were threatened and misunderstood by people whose limited grass and water they were using up as they wandered through their land. In today's Gospel, John reminds us that this is the third time they will encounter the Lord. Obviously, Jesus has not given them His postresurrection plans or a forwarding address. He spends time with them, then departs without knowing when or where they will meet again. They might not like it, but they need to prayerfully reflect on all the Lord had done, taught, and shared with them; until now, they were suffering from a terribly short memory. There were 11 serious cases of short memory. and the people of the Baby Church would need eleven leaders who were focused. committed, and inspired by them because of their own spiritual journey. It is almost comical, looking in on them. They are like children whose "Time Out" is starting to work. Just as our children, during a T-O, start fiddling with the stuff in their room because their silence and isolation have forced them to own their faults, do the same. So, what do they do? They resort to what they are familiar with as fishermen....they return to the boats; they go fishing. Not surprisingly, even the fish are giving them the silent treatment. Enter Jesus and breakfast. As has often happened with the Master, they share more than food. He spoils them rotten by not making it too tough on them when they are too embarrassed to acknowledge their initial inability to recognize the Lord. But lovingly, the Master gives them a pass on that. The story concludes with one critical issue that the Lord won't

give them a pass on, and that is Peter's denial of the Lord. Remember that when Peter spoke, he often spoke for the rest of the Apostles, who were more sheepish than he was. Each of them needed a way to broach the spiritual elephant in the room and put closure to it, namely, their denial and abandonment of the Lord when he was arrested and put on trial. This leads to Our Lord questioning Peter 3x's if he loved him, which matches the 3x's Peter denied Our Lord. Each of us knows how this concluded. So, my sisters and brothers, this Gospel story is more than a fly-on-thewall insight into a critical moment in the lives of the Apostles; it is Our Lord's insight into how much He loves each of us, of the responsibility he expects us to take for His unconditional love of each of us and an assurance that His capacity to love no know bounds, is limited by no calendar or clock or any foolishness on our part, but only our pride and an unwillingness to say "I was wrong""I am sorry," And before we have the chance to ask, "Would you forgive me?" Discover that Our Lord is entrusting us to "Feed" "Tend" "Feed" "Follow
