

Pastor's Corner December 25, 2025

After Easter, there is no more significant event in human history than **Christmas!** And like all significant events, Christmas is pregnant with parallel stories, characters, and events. All of them contribute to the significance of Christmas for humanity, their relationship with humanity's loving God, and each person's journey towards their *Father-Creator* and Eternity. The significance of Christmas can only be appreciated when all those stories, characters, and events are taken as a whole, including the great 1,500+ year history of the Jewish People, all of which took place before Our Lord was born. It is wrong to treat Salvation History as a buffet, where we choose one story or person and ignore the related persons, stories, and events.

So, how do we approach this great Holy Day as well as the Holy Season which follows this Holy Day.....this *Christmas* Day? I would suggest that a helpful way to understand the significance of Christmas is to reflect on the notion of **Visitation**, specifically, the acts of **Visiting** and **being Visited**. During Advent, we reflected on the Angel Gabriel's **visit** to Zechariah, who was preparing to lead the people in worship in the Temple. Gabriel relayed God's request to him and his wife, Elizabeth, to accept the pregnancy of the future John the Baptist. We reflected on Gabriel's **visit** to the future Blessed Mother, making a similar request, asking if she would accept an inexplicable pregnancy for God... an *Immaculate Conception*. We reflected on Gabriel's **visit** to St. Joseph, when he explained that there was no need for them to divorce, because Mary's pregnancy was not a matter of infidelity, but of God; that this was an *Immaculate*

Conception. Today, we reflect on the *Nativity* or *Birth* of Our Lord. Once again, **visitations (three of them)** figure prominently in this Sacred event. The first is when "a heavenly host of angels" **visit** a group of shepherds, who were shepherding their sheep during the night, and announce a significant event. The second **visitation** occurs when the shepherds **see** the Holy Family in a stable outside Bethlehem. A few weeks from today, we will celebrate a third **visitation** event, namely, the *Epiphany of Our Lord*, when the three Magi **visit** the Holy Family. Each of these visitations is significant. However, for some reason, I find myself focusing on the visitation of the Holy Family by the shepherds. Each of these "**visits**" wasn't one-way. They involved people of faith who believed in God, that God loves everyone He creates, and that He expects them to participate in this love relationship that He seeks to enter into with them. Why? Because He is a God who will be faithful to the promises He made to His children in the past, as well as to those He will make in their future. They are free to say "No"; to walk away from His invitation. They were also free to pursue this relationship by getting involved. The shepherds were simple, uneducated, and unsophisticated men, but they were also grounded in their Jewish faith about God and His love for His *Chosen People*.

My sisters and brothers, whether you realized it or not, God has probably **visited** you in several ways, on several occasions. It could have been under the simplest of circumstances, but no doubt it got your attention, because it challenged you to consider how seriously you take God's love for you. On this Christmas Day and in the coming weeks, as we focus on how eager God is to draw us back to Him, let us ask ourselves


how seriously we take his invitations. Just because the Angel Gabriel isn't going to visit us and look us in the eye, doesn't mean that God hasn't **visited** us, nor that God won't continue to **visit** you. He will speak to you through the example of your spouse, children, friends, co-workers, events, something you see or hear in the News or on TV, even in your daydreams. During this Christmas Season, pray... talk to God; better still, shut up and listen to God. Remember the responses of Zechariah, Joseph, Mary, the Shepherds, and the Three Magi when Gabriel visited them. Initially, they were unsettling.

Nevertheless, each of them was willing to listen with a humble heart, and because they did, God enabled them to embrace their role in His *Plan*. They would never be the same. Neither will you, if you have the humility to be open to His **visits**! Your brother in Christ,
