The people of Washington State vote into law to ban medical mandates including mask wearing, passports, digit identifications, social credit systems, and lockdowns; and creating a new section into RCW 29A.72.020.

BALLOT TITLE- Statement of Subject: Initiative Measure No. 1853 concerns prohibiting the imposition of certain mandatory public health measures.

Concise Description: This measure would prohibit government entities from requiring measures like vaccinations, mask-wearing, or lockdowns; and require private/governmental entities enforcing such measures to include exemptions and assume liability for any injuries resulting from compliance.

BALLOT MEASURE SUMMARY

This measure would prohibit the governor and any Washington state governmental entities, including cities or counties, from imposing mandatory medical procedures such as: vaccinations, mask-wearing, medical passports, digital identifications, social credit systems, and lockdowns. BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** This measure would prohibit the governor and any Washington state governmental entities, including cities or counties, from imposing mandatory medical procedures such as: vaccinations, mask-wearing, medical passports, digital identifications, social credit systems, and lockdowns. Any private or governmental entity enforcing such policies must allow for medical, religious, and philosophical exemptions and assume full liability should any related injuries occur from these policies. This measure applies to states of emergency, executive orders, and legislative acts.
