President's Message

Touring season will be here soon and the Tour Committee has been very busy planning exciting trips and activities. Tour Planners put a lot of effort into making their event memorable and run smoothly for the participants so try to attend as many events as possible. Please practice the following etiquette to help ensure a great event for everyone.

- Arrive 15-30 minutes before the departure time in order to check in with the Tour Planner to pick up your tour packet or instructions, Note: there may be last minute changes to the directions or other important announcements. Fill your gas tank before you arrive.
- The Tour Planner will lead the group, followed by Model A's and other faster antique and vintage cars. Modern cars are welcome on the tour but they must follow at the rear of the tour. If you need to leave the tour early, please notify the Tour Planner and leave at a rest stop so other cars behind you don't follow you by mistake.
- Leave a five-car length between cars so on the two-lane roads they can be safely passed by people not in our group. Don't follow too closely and don't lag too far behind.
- Cell phones will be the primary way of communicating during tours. The Tour Planner will compile a list of tour member cell phone numbers and distribute it at the start of each tour.
- Rest Stops will be taken approximately every 60-90 minutes. Depart in the same order as before. Be ready to leave on time after each pit stop or break.
- Participants are expected to carry a reasonable assortment of tools to address minor repairs on the road. Tools/spare parts may include tire jack, lug wrench, tire iron, screwdrivers, vise grips, side cutter pliers, hammer, adjustable crescent wrench, band wrench, electrical test light, jumper wire w/alligator clips, radiator stop lead, RTV silicone, rags, electrical tape, duct tape, spare tire, fan belt, fuel filter and hose, WD 40, and a quart of engine oil.

Q: How & where did you get your car-is there an interesting story about how you acquired it?

A: The 1964 Kay & I bought from a guy in Marshalltown that was needing money because of a business that wasn't doing well-we made an offer & he accepted.

A: Over a period of about 15 years we overhauled the engine, had the transmission rebuilt, put on new rocker & quarter panels, a new top, put in velour upholstery-we did all of this during the winter time so we could continue to drive it in the summer time

A: I have done the Twin River trips for 30 years

Q: Have you entered your car in any shows & if so, did you win any awards/trophies?

1957 Ford

The mainstream Ford line of cars grew substantially larger for 1957, a model which lasted through 1959. The Crown Victoria with its flashy chrome "basket handle" was no more, and the acrylic glass-roofed Crown Victoria Skyliner was replaced by a new model, the retracting-roof hardtop Skyliner.

The new chassis allowed the floor to be placed much lower, which in turn led to a lower and longer look overall. The major component of this chassis was a differential whose pinion gear was exceptionally low relative to the axleshafts, lower than in conventional hypoid differentials.

The 1957 models retained a single-headlight front end like their predecessors, but were unmistakable with their long flanks and tailfins. A plethora of trim lines was introduced, starting with the base "Custom", "Custom 300", "Fairlane", and top-line "Fairlane 500". The two Custom lines used a 116 in. wheelbase, while the Fairlanes had 118 in. between the wheels. A new car/pickup truck hybrid based on the short-wheelbase chassis was also introduced, the Ranchero.

The 223 CID OHV Straight-6 continued, now with 144 hp. The V8 lineup included a 272 CID Y-block making 190 hp, a 292 CID Thunderbird version making 212 hp, a 312 cubic inch V8 making 245 hp, and a supercharged 312 CID Thunderbird Special making 300 hp.

The radio had a transistorized audio output stage for the first time. There were lights for the generator and oil instead of gauges. The controls became recessed for more safety. A new frame was used for the 1957 Fords-it moved the perimeter rails out so that they would fully envelope the passengers.

The model was very successful, being the best selling car in America, overtaking arch rival Chevrolet for the first time since 1935.
