Hi Again To All Ole Car Folks In The CR Area! We had another Great Meeting In February Thanks Again To All Of The Help From So Many Of You!

I am enjoying getting to know many of you folks better & filling you in about more of my vehicle adventures! My next adventure I would like to relate to you is not even about one of My Cars! When I was just A Wee Guy listening to my Dads stories I was impressed with his tales of Grandpaws first tractor a John Deere Waterloo Boy. Farming was good after WW1 & about 1 year after the purchase of his first car the 90 Overland in 1917 he bought his first tractor to keep up with the Jameses the next door neighbors! What a machine it was. It ran & made lots of noise, but was not good for very much. It plowed about as much as the horses, but did not have enough power to run the thrashing machine (still needed the local steam traction engine)! That Waterloo Boy only lasted into the mid 20's when Dad watched Grandfather tip it backward while trying to pull a dead horse out of the creek.

As a farm kid in the 50's Dad took us to The Midwest Old Threshers Reunion down at Mt Pleasant many times. There I fell in love with a mint Waterloo Boy that the local John Deere dealer had never sold. I became friends with the dealer & spoke to him every year at the show. I was a sophomore at Iowa State when the dealer decided to sell out & he decided I was the one who should have the Waterloo Boy so he offered it to me for \$350! I knew it was a real opportunity, but when I told Dad he explained that since my freshman year had only cost \$1200 the \$350 was out of the question. I was very disappointed, but knew he was right about it!!

A month or so later Dad wrote to tell me he had bought me a tractor at a local farm sale – got it running & drove it to the farm! He only had to pay \$60. That is how I got my very 1st collector tractor a 1924 Mc Deering 10-20 that I had many hours & lots of fun running around the farm! Yes – Of Course I still have it & would like to get it out for some exercise one of these days!

Q: How long have you been an AACA member?


A: 39 years. Paul Kumley invited me to a meeting and then I joined.




Spotlight on John and Barb Maxwell (cont)




