In 1969 he began working for Northwestern Bell which became AT&T-he retired after a successful career there. He had been a member of Mt. Herman Lodge #263, Gethsemane White Shrine, St. Paul's United Methodist Church, & the Cedar Rapids Metal Detecting Club. Paul loved to go fishing & he thoroughly enjoyed antique cars, specifically Model T's, trips to Hershey, PA & Chickasha, OK for swap meets. He remained active in the Cedar Rapids Antique Car Club until his passing. He is survived by the mother of his children, Audrey Savage of Monticello; his children Daniel (Danielle) Kumley of Mt. Vernon, Matthew Kumley of Monticello, & Sarah (Bill) Jones of Dyer, IN; grandsons Mason Kumley & Henry Jones; sisters Doris Hatcher of Durango, CO & Jean Billings of Waterford, MI; numerous nieces & nephews. Paul was preceded in death by his sister, Judy Kumley, daughter Rebecca Kumley, & his parents.

John Maxwell passed away July 6, 2023. John was born on Feb. 27, 1940 in Cedar Rapids, Ia. Growing up in Shellsburg John ate at his uncle's restaurant after school & helped at his father's farm & hardware store. John got his first car at 13, began flying planes at 14, flew his first solo flight at 16. He graduated from Shellsburg HS in 1957, after which he flew a mail route & did crop dusting. In 1961 John enlisted in the Air Force. While in the military he trained in communication systems. He was then hired by Northwestern Bell where he began his career as a lineman then worked on teletypes & telephone communication systems. It was during this time he met Barbara Peterson at a local party. A year & a half later he proposed with a ring purchased from his father's store. John & Barbara were married Dec. 6, 1964 & first lived in Shellsburg; then bought a house in Fairfax where their children were born; the built a new house in rural Cedar Rapids. John was transferred to AT&T & later retired after 30 years as a communications engineer. He then worked for his friend & neighbor caring for his estate, where his duties ranged from raising trumpeter swans for the Dept. Of Natural Resources to piloting a yacht on a journey down the Mississippi River. John & Barb loved to travel the USA as well as Europe & the UK, most memorably, Scotland. John had a lifelong interest in cars, restoring many gorgeous antique automobiles from a Model A to Corvettes, antique tractors, & even his favorite fire chief pedal car toy from childhood. The most beloved of his restorations is a 1917 Maxwell touring sedan which he spent a decade bringing to perfection. He competed with the car on the AACA show circuit, achieving a first prize at the national junior & senior level & a second prize at the grand national level. John enjoyed anything with wheels. He also volunteered at St. Luke's Hospital for 10 years. Recently John & Barb bought a home around the corner from their son, Sean, in Marion.

John is survived by his wife, Barbara & their children Sean (Gloria) Maxwell of Marion, IA & Jennifer Maxwell of New Bedford, MA. He was preceded in death by his parents as well as his brothers James & Lawrence Maxwell & sister Genevieve England.


