All it was - was parts that I still have & because someone removed the spark plugs the engine was not useable. Well I had my first model T at age 10.

My first running T took another year when dad placed a free ad in the Farm Bureau Spokesman. A guy from Center Point wrote & said he had a Model T he wanted to sell so he could work on his Chevrolet. It was probably several weeks before I was able to talk dad into a road trip to see what he had. When we got there it turned out to be a very nice 26 T Roadster Pickup. Unfortunately he had just sold the body to some hot rodders from Cedar Rapids, but they did not want the chassis for their project. As a result we got the rolling runnable chassis for \$10. When we went back to get it they still hadn't picked up the body so we had to take it off for them - let me tell you that was a very hard thing to do. We managed to load it on our boat trailer that dad had built for our fishing boat. Getting that T going Is another story, but provided a drivable Chassis that drove all over the farm for many years. Q: How old were you when you got your first car and what was it?

Q: How and where did you get your car—is there an interesting story about how you acquired it?

A: I had a Des Moines Register paper route and my route covered the 16th Ave business district. This was when Penicks and Iowa Manufacturing were running three shifts and all the bars were open for those who either wanted to stop just after work or on their way to work for a quick drink. The car was sitting on the street with a For Sale sign and I went home and told my dad. He agreed to go look at it and when we did we took down the phone numbers and back home gave the owners a call. Soon after that, I was the proud owner of a '60 Rambler with my school permit and did I mention that the seats folded down!!

Q: What kind of condition was it in--did you have to do much work on it?

A: It was in great condition since it had been own by an older couple.

Q: What was the most memorable /interesting thing or trip you've gone on with an antiques car?

A: Over the years we have gone to many AACA sponsored car shows so Jack could judge. I was usually hanging out with our kids under a tree as we picnicked until dad was done. Often times, our little group consisted of Jack's parents, Jack, Sr. and Eleanor, and both of them also judged. I've Got A Water Leak! How Do I Find It?

Water leaks are common on older cars, but sometimes finding them can be a real pain...

Here are some tips for finding water leaks in cars from guys in the automotive industry:

Get some talcum powder and mist it around the window and door opening seals (or anywhere you think it's leaking), and close it up. Now hit it with a water hose, and then give it a while for the water to shed. Now look at the seals. If it's leaking there will be a water trail cut through the powder.

Another way to find them is to use an air hose and direct a blast of air inside the car in the area you think is leaking. Have someone outside the car spray that area at the same time. It will bubble where it's leaking.

And finally, door seals are usually bad about leaking, so take a dollar bill or piece of paper and shut it in the door where you think it's leaking. Now pull on it and move it around. It should be hard to move, but if you find a spot with almost or no resistance, you've found your water leak...
