President's Message

Hi Again To All You Great Ole Car People In The CR Area! May has been another Good But Busy time! The Model A Spring Swap was a good time with perfect weather & good attendance all the way around. Thanks too everyone who made it so Great! I think things will get even better as people get used to the new location? The summer is well planned & progress on our swap on 27 August is good. We are also planning on a Local AACA Car Show with Bass Farms & I hope many of you will bring an Ole Car out for the fun with no judging on Aug 6 from 10-2.

Evidently many of you have been following the Railton Tail so back to it! What Ian & I figured is someone was worried about the Farmer from Iowa doing so well, running in the top, coming into Reno so in the old Race Tradition they decided to try & make sure that we did not stay there at the top! What they did was fill a red shop rag with parking lot dust & sand, pop open the boattail , open the large competion cap & drop the bomb into the tank. That is why we had never run more than 50 miles since Reno without plugging the fuel system someplace. They of course did not realize that there was no need to sabotage us because the engine machinist had already done that when he set the bearing clearances so tight that we tossed 4 of the 8 rods before giving in & stopped running the engine!

Another thing Ian & I found was lucky for us! Remember that this is the FRESH rebuild that the machinist had promised us after his mistakes (that all of a sudden was not free)! Remember this was a complete rebuild that I had never properly Run IN to break it in so everything was tight. After setting for several years again We found that that several valves were sticking - giving us bad compression in several cylinders. No problem – We pulled the Head to loosen the valves! As we looked down into the cylinders We had Near Heart Failure when we noticed a grove made by 1 of the wrist pins rubbing the cylinder wall!!!! You know what that caused! We had to pull the pan & remove that piston & rod. What we found there was that the same SOB that had caused the ruin of the first engine had left out one of the wrist pin clips that kept the full floating wrist pin inside of the piston. There was nothing we could do, but hone that cylinder as good as we could and put it back together! We are SO Lucky we had to pull the head because that wristpin would have - if not fixed - led to a total engine Failure later on!! I now report that it runs So Fine & Strong that the 3,000 miles in the 2016 Great Race was pulled off with No Problems from the Engine at all!
