We were told how to treat the cuts that are made from trimming. Trees seal not heal an injury-it will grow closed. You should only prune Oak trees in the winter such as, January or February, not during their growing season. She also told us how to plant new trees the right depth, size of hole, and how to mulch properly. She gave us ideas of the kind of trees that are stronger and ones that can be placed better in some spots than others. She told how to water new trees and how much to use. She gave us lots of great information.
