President's Message

Back to my original restoration for the '84 Great American Race. I did not want to leave anything to chance so I had the gas tank (leaked Badly) restored with the bottom cut out, completely cleaned and new turn plate bottom put in. The fuel lines were replaced with new & an electric fuel pump was added incase the mechanical one failed. I added a fuel pressure regulator & a fuel filter placed next to the carb that was a new old stock. Remember the first day of the race when Ted & I were running in the top 5 before the 2nd rod let go coming into Reno NV and we spent most of the night on the sandy parking lot behind the Dunes Casino taking out the rod & piston so we could leave in the morning running on 7. Very strange - the next day we ran the fuel filter plugged with sand & we had to stop beside the road & clean it before we could run again?

After that when I had the engine rebuilt and started to try & use her the filter plugged every day & once the pump stopped because it was completely packed with sand that I couldn't even clean out. The mechanical fuel pump even quit because of sand in the valves. Well the engine ran, but because she wasn't reliable I ,in frustration, quit driving her again!

Fast forward a couple more years & Ian (our youngest) & I decided that the Railton was just too nice of a car to leave parked. We decided to figure out the problem & start using her again since the Hudson Nationals were going to be In Wisconsin & most of the Club had never had a chance to even see our spectacular British/American Sports car. We moved her into the shop & tore into her. I wanted to figure out the fuel issue & with the gas low in the tank I looked through the race tank fill & could see that the whole bottom was covered with sand! So Ian & I dropped the tank (no easy job) & took off the fuel level gage assembly so we could clean it out! When we sloshed it back & forth we could hear something sloshing around. Well to our complete surprise we found a red shop cloth and 2 cups of fine sand!!!


