Club Member Spotlight on Al and Marlene Meeker

Q: How old were you when you got your first car and what was it?

A: I was 16 and it was a 1955 Ford

Q: What cars do you own?

A: 1952 Studebaker 6 door pickup which I built, 1952 Studebaker 1/2-ton pickup which I've owned 54 years, 1952 Studebaker highly modified pickup sitting on a tube frame Corvette powered and transaxle. The theme for this truck is No body panel left molested.

Q: Which is your favorite?

A: The 6 door

Q: How & where did you get your first old car-is there an interesting story about how you acquired it?

A: I bought my 1952 Studebaker pickup when I was 19 years old. Yes, there is an interesting story behind this. It goes like this. I was raised on a farm near Eldora, Iowa. I had a friend my age living about two miles away. We both were hard on the farm machinery so when we turned 16 and got our driver's license neither one of our dads would let us have the family car to go into town but his dad had this 1950 Studebaker truck (just an old farm truck) that we could use to go to town. The overdrive didn't work so we only could go about 30 MPH and going 7 - 8 miles to town took quite awhile for a 16-year-old. Two boys not trained in anything started messing around with the overdrive and we got it to start working. Now we could go about 50 mph. We used this truck to drive around the timber looking for places to hunt and on Saturdays we would drive it to town to play pool. Forward another year and we each had acquired our own cars. I graduated High School and went to technical school then started work at Collins Radio. Then 6 months later I had a chance to buy this 1952 Studebaker pickup. I remembered all the great times I had with my friends' truck so I bought it. I never had a car that would squeal the tires which was important to me at the time actually it is still important to me even today. I paid \$35 for the truck. It had a tired flat head 6 with overdrive so the first thing was to swap the motor for healthy v8. I've had this same truck for 54 years and how finishing up putting in my 11th drive train. I chose a GM 6.0-liter motor with a 6-speed automatic transmission with overdrive. It will have over 400 horses. I need this so I'm not late for coffee. I have driven all around the united stated attending National Studebaker Conventions and coast to coast vacations.

Q: What kind of condition was it in, did you have to do much work on it?

A: It was in average shape body but the motor not so much. My first motor swap came in 6 weeks.

A: In 1993 was an 8-day tour from Independence, MO to Portland, OR following the Oregon Trail set up by the Studebaker Drivers Club going to the national convention in Portland.

A: I have in excess of 50 trophies mostly first place with the 6 door and numerous trophies with my blue truck.



Answers to Sharon's Automobile Trivia:

Buick was named after David D. Buick who started in the plumbing business but went on to become a pioneer in internal combustion engines which evolved into the automobile business.


Chevrolet was named after race car driver Louis Chevrolet.

Nash got its name from Charles W. Nash who bought the Jeffery Motor Car Company in 1917 and named it after himself. Charles Nash was at one time President of Buick.

Studebaker was named for the Studebaker brothers. They were known for making quality wagons in the 19th century.

Pontiac is named for Chief Pontiac. Pontiac, Michigan is also named for Chief Pontiac.

Willys is named for John North Willys who was the U.S. Ambassador to Poland. He was also involved in the Overland car company which later became the Willys Overland Co. The Willys Overland Co. went bankrupt in 1942 and stopped production. However the company was sold to Kaiser Frazer, then to American Motors and then to Chrysler therefore the name lives on.

The rioting in major cities across the U.S. has spread to Sun Lakes, Arizona, a retirement community of over 30,000. Looters in Arizona's friendliest hometown have especially broken into stores that sell items like laxatives, vitamins, hearing aids, reading glasses, energy drinks, and surgical stockings. The Seniors were easily caught and arrested since they were using their walkers and golf carts to flee. The protests have been limited to the evening hours because most of the lawbreakers either had doctor's appointments during the day or rioting would have interfered with their naps. The marches didn't last that long because many of the demonstrators had to get home to pee. In many cases, the demonstrators simply forgot why they were even there. Officials considered a curfew starting at 9 p.m. but since that's the time when most of the residents go to bed anyway, it was decided that it wasn't needed. Community leaders concluded that part of the problem was that residents were restless because they had too much time on their hands since the recreation centers, pools, theaters, boutique stores and especially the bars were closed due to the corona virus. Community officials wanted to form a committee to look further into the problem, but the next day no one could remember why they needed a committee.




