



CAMP MEDICATION PROTOCOLS

If your child needs medication (including rescue inhalers and EpiPens), you must adhere to the following guidelines:

- Morning/evening dose of medications should be given before or after your child attends camp. Only medications with a dosage schedule that cannot be adjusted for camp hours should be administered during the day.
- ALL medications must be kept in the child's bag and a Camp Supervisor must be informed by an adult.
- All medications must be in their original packaging and labeled with appropriate prescription, dosing and/or pharmaceutical information. Liquid medication must be accompanied with an appropriate measuring cup/syringe.
- Children should be able to administer their medication. We will remind your child to take their medication however we will not be administering any medication.
- A parent/guardian or an individual listed under Authorized Pick-Up may stop by to administer medication.
- Sticks Stones and Bonez will not be held liable for a child refusing to take their medication.
