Kassôzowôgan / Living together

We recognize and appreciate the diversity of our learning community and know we have much to learn from each other in addition to Alnôbaôdwa (speaking the Abenaki language.)

Living in immersion community is exciting, challenging and intense! Please use self-care strategies that work for you, so you can take care of your mental, physical, emotional and spiritual health, while experiencing community and learning Alnôbaôdwawôgan.

Living in community means we also need to take care of each other, the people who support us, our physical space & things, in the same conscientious ways. Pakaldamikhozowôgan - Honor the Pledge!

Speak up! Ask for help, don't offer help.

Wladakawawôgan / The good way one acts toward someone

Take good care of yourself and respect each other

- o respect personal boundaries, be kind and considerate, don't assume!
- o be responsible for your own learning, personal spaces, and possessions
- o rest & participation are both important: attend to your needs & prioritize classes

Take good care of our safe(r) space

- o Respect each other. Try your best: we will make mistakes and can still be responsible
- o no taking photographs without permission, no posting on social media

Kassôzowôgan / Living together

- Respect for our space & each other means tidying up after yourself & see beyond yourself respectfully. Finding shared space is a gift. The way you leave the space is your gift to others.
- Safety is everyone's responsibility, wawizid (co-learner) included.
- Allergies: Latex, scents, more: don't wear fragrance, avoid heavy scents, don't leave food out.
- Bug spray: apply outside & away from others & doors, pay attention to wind (be downwind).
- o Communicate with Nanadawaldagik if you can't attend scheduled time, need to leave early, etc.

Adalagakidimek / Classes

- o Be seated by the time class starts arrive early enough to be ready at start time.
- o Communicate with Nanawaldak, notify Kalli if you'll be late in am. We take attendance.
- o Class participation includes cleaning up. Putting things away is a part of ending class.
- o When you're late/need to leave early, do so calmly and quietly to respect others.

Odanaiwigwômal / Townhouses

- o If you see problems or something broken, need supplies (like TP) tell Kalli or email.
- Keep windows closed so AC can work well.
- Decide as a living community your house times for quiet hours, laundry hours, etc.
- Keep kitchen clean help keep community spaces tidy and safe.

Abapskwedak / Woodstove Room in Proctor (Dining Hall)

- o Clear off tables after meals, bring dishes back, pick up random items left behind!
- Keep your belongings together so seats stay open for others.
- Assist to reset chairs for class time, if you can.

KAGALNEMEN / Brackett

Kagalnemen / Brackett is Faculty housing AND classroom space. Respect our home:

- o 11 am 9 pm open hours for wawijizik (learners), unless you have an appointment.
- o Do not enter marked hallways or use laundry facilities here.
- o Available bathrooms: Tabsagok hallway past elevator & Kitchen hallway: 144, 145.
- o Classrooms 106 & 206 are only open during class hours, or with permission.

Tabsagok / Basement (at the lower room)

- o Craft table & supplies are in basement & available for everyone to share.
- o Put things away. Remember if you use glue gun, be sure to unplug it!
- o Create props for projects although no latex balloons anywhere, please.

Spemsagok / Upstairs lounge (at the upper room)

- o A good space for sewing and other hand crafts and to clean up after yourself.
- o It's also a classroom, so don't touch teaching materials, but put your things away!

Ôdabowôgan / Main Lounge

- Pay attention help keep community space tidy, especially games by window A/C.
- o Do not enter area or touch Eagle Feather Staff, drums any items by north windows.
- o Keep pathways open, move chairs back when finished.
