

HOW TO MAKE A HANGING SLEEVE

Cut a strip of backing fabric 4 ½ inches wide by the width of the quilt, minus 4 inches.
(The sleeve needs to be shorter than the width of the quilt so that the opening for the sleeve will stay open and not be sew into the binding.)

On the two short sides, sew a double fold short-tail seam. (fold under about ¼ inch and fold again another ¼ inch and stitch down.)



Along ONE of the long sides, turn under about ¼ inch, only one time, and stitch.



Matching the raw edges of the quilt and sleeve, and center of the sleeve and the center of the top of the quilt, pin in place from center to end on the front side of the quilt. (This will be sewn in place with the binding.)
