### From the Director:

Making theatre in the era of COVID sometimes feels like an exercise in futility—how on earth can we do this when we are supposed to be social distancing and bringing people together in one room isn't safe? When we tell our performers to sing out and project, but we can't breathe on each other? It really feels at times like an impossible problem—but a problem that the staff of FCP feels we were able to solve with a number of productions over the summer and even into the fall. However, when it came to staging a full-on musical? I was stymied.

A musical means an orchestra and singing and many people on stage. Musicals are also expensive to produce (the rights and royalties along are often 4 times what we pay to perform a play) and how can we pay for that when we cannot seat more than 100 patrons at any given performance? Can you feel my panic?

Then one day at work, Amanda mentioned a show she had seen when she attended the 2019 Edinburgh Fringe Festival. It was a two-person musical called The Last Five Years, which she had also seen when it was adapted for film in 2014. She told me I should check it out, so that night I watched the film and was charmed. It was funny, and sad, and moving and TRUE. It was a story I believed could have happened—almost as if I knew these people. And as an added bonus, the music was wonderful.

The very next day, I reached out to Jillian and Kyle to see if they would be interested in performing this musical. It has to be said that while I strongly believe in the audition process, and really don't like casting a show this way, in the time of COVID this seemed to be the safest and smartest way. Needless to say, they said yes! And now you, our audience, get to see live theatre, performed, in a way that is safe for performers and audience alike.

On top of a strange year, this has been the weirdest rehearsal process I've ever been a part of: from quarantines stopping rehearsals for two weeks and the community risk level increasing, thereby forcing postponement of the performance for 2 months to all of the precautions we have practiced to keep us all safe. But it has all come together, resulting in this simple, beautifully-told story, performed by two accomplished performers, accompanied by incredibly gifted musicians. I just want to thank all of them from the bottom of my heart for making this show come to life.

Jason studied composition at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, N.Y., with Samuel Adler, Christopher Rouse, and Joseph Schwantner. Jamie has also performed in previous FCP productions including Mary Poppins, The Little Mermaid, and The Secret Garden.
