Our HERstory Continues: Installation of Officers

On Sunday, January 24, 2021, we held our 2nd Installation of Officers. Vanessa J. Moore (President), Donna J. Collier (Vice-President), Cameka N. Gardner (Recording Secretary), Crystal J. Bryant (Corresponding Secretary), and Kim L. Brown (Treasurer). Recognizing that the election brought us the first Woman and the 1st Woman of color as the Vice President of the United States, we adopted the theme: Our Season: Women of Color in Leadership. We invited our Sister Metris Batts, who currently serves as the First Vice President of the GFWC Miami Woman's Club, to hold our installation. She has been a member of the GFWC for more than 12 years. She instructed us to look to our Legacy for inspiration.

For the office of President, who better than Harriet Tubman to be the inspirational Legacy for this position. Her remarkable courage and determination led her not only to escape slavery but also to lead other enslaved people to freedom. This prominent political activist and abolitionist was also the first woman to lead an armed expedition during the American Civil War. For the office of Vice President, this position serves as the backbone and sounding board of the President. The person must be undaunting, fearless, firm, and with the ability to provide objective advice and insight. The inspirational Legacy for this position is Vice President Kamala Harris. For the office of Recording Secretary, the inspirational Legacy for this position is Condoleezza Rice. She was the first female African-American Secretary of State and the First Woman to serve as National Security Advisor. According to the U.S. Heart Health Statistics (DNA Weekly, 2021), approximately 647,000 Americans die from heart disease each year, 1 in every 4 deaths. One in five heart attacks is silent, with the person unaware of it. Six (6) warning signs of a heart attack include 1) tightness in the chest, 2) nausea, indigestion, and heartburn, 3) shortness of breath, 4) cold sweat, 5) fatigue, and 6) sudden dizziness. Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month

"You know, you do need mentors, but in the end, you really just need to believe in yourself." – Diana Ross

Teen dating violence is an issue that impacts everyone, not only teens who are experiencing dating violence but also their parents, teachers, friends, and community. Statistics show that 26% of women and 15% of men experience intimate partner violence for the first time before age 18. February is National Teen Dating Violence and Awareness Month. During this month, Americans are called upon to raise awareness about teen dating violence and educating teens about safe, healthy relationships.

Nationwide, youth ages 12 to 19 experience the highest rates of rape and sexual assault. Dating violence is a type of intimate partner violence that occurs between two people in a close relationship. The nature of dating violence can be physical, emotional, or sexual. Studies show that approximately 10% of adolescents report being the victim of physical violence at the hands of an intimate partner during the previous year. Girls are particularly vulnerable to experiencing violence in their relationships and are more likely to suffer long-term behavioral and health consequences, including suicide attempts, eating disorders, and drug use. Adolescents in abusive relationships often carry these unhealthy patterns of violence into future relationships. Those who are victimized or witness violent acts bring these experiences with them in other areas of their life, even later into teen relationships. Ultimately, they can end up as the victim or perpetrator of adult intimate partner violence.

Double Good Gourmet Popcorn Fundraiser

The club held its first fundraiser of the year, selling Double Good gourmet popcorn. The fourday virtual fundraiser started on Friday, March 5, and ended Tuesday, March 9.

The club raised \$14,154 and received \$7,077 from the total, a 50% profit from the sale. The fundraiser was chaired by Cynthia Barber and cochaired by Diedra Lane. Eighteen (18) club members established pop-up stores and sold popcorn. The club also received \$310 in cash donations to support the fundraiser; therefore, the club's net profit from the fundraiser is \$7,387. Proceeds from the fundraiser will support clubsponsored community service projects within Tallahassee and surrounding areas.

One Blood Drive

The Sisters of Service clubwomen hosted it's 3rd blood drive in conjunction with OneBlood Blood Bank on March 13, in the Walmart parking lot located on N. Monroe Street. The club achieved its goal to collect and donate 10 pints of blood. The club hosts a blood drive every 56 days. The next. blood drive is tentatively scheduled for May 8, 2021. Health & Wellness: Get The COVID-19 Vaccine

As restrictions begin to loosen and people start to get out more, everyone must do their part to stop the spread of COVID-19. Wearing a mask is the easiest step all of us can take to ensure that we remain safe and keep everyone around us safe as well, but we can also get vaccinated. The COVID-19 vaccine helps protect you from getting COVID-19. Here are a few community agencies offering vaccinations to eligible individuals:

- FAMU's Alfred Lawson Jr. Multipurpose Center (1800 Wahnish Way) site offers walk-up vaccinations to eligible individuals from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. seven days a week. Individuals should bring a valid photo ID. Preregistration is encouraged, but not necessary. Those seeking to be vaccinated can pre-register online at: <u>https://commvax.patientportalfl.com/s/?</u> <u>language=en_US</u>
- Select Publix, Walmart and Sam's Club stores in Leon County have begun scheduling COVID-19 vaccinations for eligible individuals. Appointments are required at each location and can be made on the following websites: Publix: https://www.publix.com/covidvaccine/florida; Walmart: http://www.walmart.com/COVIDvaccine; Sam's Club: http://www.samsclub.com/covid
- The Florida Department of Health in Leon County is offering COVID-19 vaccines to eligible individuals with pre-registration open at <u>https://myvaccine.fl.gov/</u>. Those without internet access can pre-register by calling (866) 200-3856. For those requiring TTY access, the phone number is (833) 476-1455. For more information, call (833) 540-2054 or visit <u>leon.floridahealth.gov</u>.
- Community partners offer to transport seniors to COVID-19 vaccination clinics via the Lyft Ride United Program. 2-1-1 in partnership with The United Way, 2-1-1 Big Bend, and Lyft is offering transportation to COVID-19 vaccine sites through the Lyft Ride United Program. The project provides safe and reliable door to door rides to COVID-19 vaccine appointments at walk-up COVID-19 vaccination sites. Rides can be set up by calling (850) 617-6325 between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.
