

On May 8, 2020, Vanessa J. Moore sent communications to the Second Vice President of the General Federation of Women's Clubs Florida to request a meeting to discuss the opportunity to start a new club under the GFWC Florida. Endowed with all the information to move forward...our journey began. On May 17, 2020, 19 Women gathered in the midst of a Pandemic via a Zoom meeting. A motion was moved and properly 2nd that these women present would start a Woman's Club for the sole purpose of giving back to the community, with a vision to ensure that the needs of the community would be met. These Women also decided that the name of the club would be representational of the club's vision. So, by a unanimous vote, the Sisters of Service Woman's Club was born.

The vision of the club was to bring together Women who were diverse in age, culture, educational levels, professions, and faith but share a common passion: making a difference in our community by changing lives. We needed a brand in the form of a logo that would reiterate our working goal: Unity in Diversity, which also happens to be the motto of the GFWC. Our logo depicts 4 Women, diverse in culture, joined together by a common purpose. The colors within are black, purple, and white, which are the club's official colors. The color black represents strength, seriousness, power, and authority; the color white represents purity, goodness, illumination, and beginnings; and the color purple represents royalty, benevolence, passion, and courage.

On May 31, 2020, 24 Women gathered again via a Zoom meeting, and the now formed club held its first election of officers. The GFWC Second Vice President, Sara Dessureau, was the installing officer. The Charter Executive Board is Vanessa J. Moore, Founding President, Donna J. Collier, Vice-President, Cameka N. Gardner, Recording Secretary, Crystal J. Bryant, Corresponding Secretary, and Kim L. Brown, Treasurer. Precious Boatwright was immediately appointed as the Parliamentarian. Congratulations, Ladies, you have just made history.


