Planting Pinwheels During Child Abuse Prevention Month

GFWC Sisters of Service clubwomen planted pinwheel gardens to bring awareness to Child Abuse Prevention Month. They planted pinwheels at the Mahan Oaks Center (2898 Mahan Drive) and the Lincoln Neighborhood Center (438 W. Brevard Street), located in Tallahassee, FL. The month of April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month, in which communities work together to help families thrive and prevent child maltreatment. According to the US Department of Health and Human Services (2021), six (6) protective factors can help increase children's well-being and reduce the likelihood of maltreatment. These protective factors include:

- Nurturing and attachment;
- Knowledge of parenting and child and youth development;
- Parental resilience;
- Social connections;
- Concrete supports for parents; and
- Social and emotional competence of children.
