


Topic: - False Alarms



The help and advice you need to keep vulnerable people safe

First of all we would never want to discourage anyone from making an emergency 999 call or operating a fire alarm, if they genuinely believe there is a fire.

However, please consider that each false alarm diverts emergency vehicles away from real emergencies

Over the last two weeks crews within Western Service Delivery Group have responded to 9 emergency calls where the Smoke Alarm has falsely operated due to non-fire conditions with the activations being as a result of cooking fumes, burnt toast, smoking fumes etc.,



Our main concern is that frequent false alarms in a building or home can cause staff/occupiers to become complacent and less willing to react when a fire alarm actuates as a result of a real fire.

> If your smoke alarm sounds, never assume it is a false alarm.

Staffordshire Fire and Rescue Service recommend that the following alarms are sited as detailed:-

The general rule is quite easy

- Kitchen and Garage Heat alarms •
- Landings Ionisation smoke alarms or combined optical smoke and heat alarms
- Bedrooms, living rooms and hallway Optical smoke alarms or combined optical smoke and heat alarms

The fitting of heat alarms in these areas will reduce the number of false activation due to cooking fumes etc.,

Sheltered Scheme Owners - What you can do to help

How to help prevent false activations:-

- Seek advice from your local Prevention Team who want to support your residents We can offer Fire Safety Talks to groups
 - We can visit your residents in their home; we can look at where they have their cooking
 - equipment is sited in relation to the smoke alarm, we can offer general Fire Safety Advice
- Ensure that your residents do not smoke in communal areas
- Ensure that any doors between their residence and the communal areas are closed
- Investigate all false alarms and look at what you can do to stop them happening again

Please Ensure that all your residences are aware of any emergency procedures that you have in place
