Pre-Procedure Instructions for anti-wrinkle treatment

To ensure optimal results and minimize the chance of complications from your toxin treatment, please adhere to the following guidelines:

1. Medication and Supplements:

- Avoid blood-thinning medications such as aspirin, ibuprofen, and naproxen for at least one week prior to your appointment to minimize bruising.
- o Discontinue use of supplements such as vitamin E, fish oil, ginkgo biloba, and other herbal supplements that may increase bleeding, one week before treatment.
- Cease the application of any skin products containing retinol or alpha hydroxy acids (AHAs) one week before your procedure to reduce skin sensitivity.
- I encourage to take Zinc supplements before and after initiating the anti-wrinkle treatment (study shows it prolongs the effect).

2. Alcohol and Dietary Considerations:

- Refrain from consuming alcoholic beverages for 24 hours before your treatment as alcohol can contribute to swelling and increase the risk of bruising.
- Stay hydrated but avoid excessive caffeine and salty foods the day of your procedure to help reduce fluid retention and potential swelling.

3. Skin Care and Exposure:

- o Do not apply makeup on the treatment area on the day of your procedure to maintain a clean and sterile environment.
- o Protect your skin from excessive sun exposure and avoid tanning beds for at least two weeks before your treatment to prevent skin irritation.

4. Other Health Considerations:

- Please inform your provider if you have had any recent dental work or vaccinations, as these might need to be scheduled appropriately around your toxin treatment.
- o Avoid any chemical peels or laser treatments on the face for at least two weeks prior to your toxin injections to ensure the skin's integrity is not compromised.
