- Seek immediate legal consultation
- Document everything thoroughly

## **School Safety Concerns**

- Report to school administration immediately
- Contact local law enforcement if necessary
- File incident reports
- Request emergency IEP meeting
- Consider temporary placement change

# **Resource Evaluation and Verification**

## **Evaluating Online Resources**

## **Quality Indicators:**

- Author credentials: Check qualifications and expertise
- **Publication date**: Ensure information is current
- **Source citations**: Look for references to research
- Organization reputation: Verify credibility
- Bias assessment: Consider perspective and agenda

## **Red Flags:**

- Promises of "cures" or unrealistic outcomes
- Requests for significant upfront payments
- Lack of professional credentials
- Testimonials without supporting evidence
- High-pressure sales tactics

## **Verifying Professional Credentials**

## **Attorneys:**

- State bar association websites
- Disciplinary records check
- Experience in special education law
- Client references

#### **Educational Advocates:**

- Training and certification verification
- References from other families
- Experience with similar cases
- Professional association membership

#### **Healthcare Providers:**

- State licensing board verification
- Board certification status
- Hospital affiliations
- Malpractice history check

## **Getting Referrals**

#### **Best Sources:**

- Other parents with similar experiences
- PTI centers
- Disability organizations
- Healthcare providers
- School personnel (sometimes)

## **Questions to Ask:**

- What specific services did they provide?
- How was their communication style?
- What were the outcomes?

- Would you use them again?
- Any concerns or drawbacks?

## **Building Your Resource Library**

## **Essential Resources to Collect:**

- State PTI contact information
- Local disability organizations
- Emergency crisis numbers
- Educational advocate contacts
- Attorney references
- Medical provider information

## **Organization System:**

- Contact database with notes
- Physical and digital filing system
- Regular updates and verification
- Easy access during emergencies

## **Networking Strategies**

#### **Connect with Other Parents:**

- Join local parent groups
- Attend disability organization events
- Participate in IEP meetings as observer
- Use social media groups appropriately

## **Build Professional Relationships:**

- Maintain positive school relationships
- Develop healthcare provider network
- Connect with service providers
- Join professional organizations

## **Maintaining Your Network**

## **Regular Activities:**

- Update contact information annually
- Share resources with other parents
- Attend training and conferences
- Participate in advocacy activities
- Provide feedback to organizations

## **Giving Back:**

- Mentor newer parents
- Share successful strategies
- Volunteer with organizations
- Provide testimonials for helpful resources
- Advocate for systems improvement

Remember: Building a strong resource network takes time, but it's one of the most valuable investments you can make in your advocacy journey. Start with one or two key resources and gradually expand your network as you learn about additional needs and opportunities.
