## The Jail

From tall tales to real trails of justice—peek inside the Village jail.

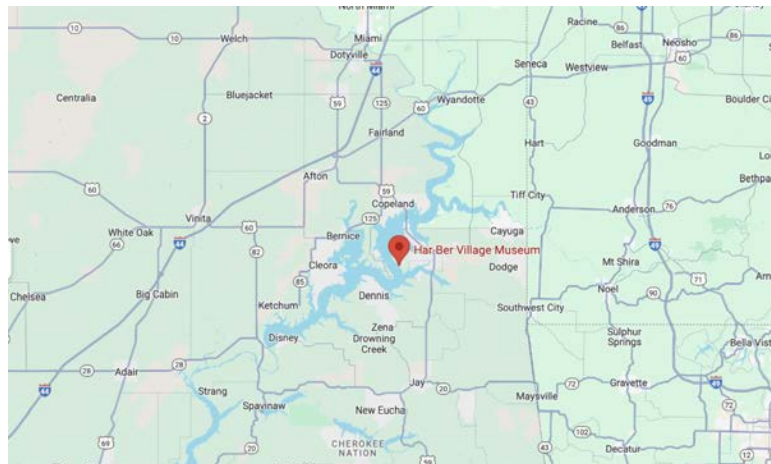
Step inside the Har-Ber Village jail and glimpse law and order on the frontier. Small-town jails like this one were designed for short stays—holding travelers who'd had one too many, card sharps caught cheating, or prisoners awaiting the county marshal. Thick doors, barred windows, and sparse furnishings remind us that confinement was simple, swift, and local. In Indian Territory and early Oklahoma, community peace officers, sheriffs, and marshals worked across vast distances with few resources. This exhibit highlights everyday justice—booking, keeping the peace, and handing detainees over to the court—while separating Hollywood myth from reality. Look for replicas of restraint devices, a duty log, and posted “house rules” to see what behavior could land you behind bars.


