#### Hamlins Wizard Oil

Hamlin's Wizard Oil was a popular 19th-century patent medicine advertised as a cure-all for everything from rheumatism and toothaches to sprains and sore throats. Marketed with extravagant claims and lively traveling shows, it gained widespread attention across the United States. Like many remedies of its time, it contained a mix of alcohol, herbs, and other ingredients, offering temporary relief more through its strong scent and numbing effect than true healing properties. Today, it's remembered as a classic example of America's early "snake oil" era of medicine.

#### **Rules for Teachers included:**

- The teacher who performs his labor faithfully and without fault for five years will be given an increase of twenty-five cents per week in his pay, providing the Board of Education approves.

#### **School Punishments were serious:**

- Boys going to Girls' Play Places? 3 lashes
- Climbing for Every Foot Over Three Feet Up a Tree? 1 lash
