## **Vice-President Report**

## **Old Issues and New Challenges**

I have been involved with this group since 2007, when it was known as the "International Organisation of Physical Therapists in Women's Health." Now, I have the honor of serving on the Executive Board as the Vice-President of the International Organisation for Physiotherapists in Pelvic and Women's Health (IOPPWH). As we reflect on our history and mission, we encounter both old issues and new challenges.

Jill Boissonnault from the USA founded and served as the first President of this group in 1998, bringing together 14 member countries. She was inspired by high-quality research highlighting the role of physiotherapists in various phases of women's lives, such as urogynecology, obstetrics, and breast health. Despite the evidence supporting the effectiveness of physiotherapeutic interventions in addressing women's health issues, access to physiotherapy services remains limited globally, necessitating educational efforts, specific skills training, knowledge translation, and advocacy.

The potential for physiotherapists to enhance women's health globally remains largely untapped. While our field possesses a vast body of knowledge, skills, and competencies in women's health, it must not be overlooked.

In May 2019, under the presidency of Gill Brook (UK) the organisation agreed a name change to International Organisation of Physical Therapists in Pelvic and Women's Health (IOPTPWH) following an extensive consultation with the membership. The name change aimed to accommodate the needs of

professionals who focus on pelvic health in men, children, and transgender populations.

This shift presented new challenges, alongside the ongoing issues that demand our attention and action to maintain progress and prevent regression in women's health physiotherapy achievements. In June 2023, under the leadership of the President Melissa Davidson (New Zealand), the organisation changed its name to the "International Organisation for Physiotherapists in Pelvic and Women's Health" (IOPPWH), aligning with the name change of World Physical Therapy to World Physiotherapy.

I am pleased that our executive board is diligently working on a strategic plan to address these challenges, ensuring that the important concerns raised by our member countries are considered and the women's health issues are not left behind. As Vice-President of this organisation, I am enthusiastic and committed to advancing our potential for leadership and transformation in research, education, and advocacy in both women's health physiotherapy and pelvic health globally.

## Member's reports

#### **Brazil**



Associação Brasileira de Fisioterapia em Saúde da Mulher Brazilian Association of Women's Health Physiotherapy

The Brazilian Association of Physiotherapy in Women's Health (ABRAFISM) is a civil, non-profit association, representing Physiotherapists who work in the area of Women's Health in Brazil. It was created by physiotherapists from all over the country, gathered in an assembly during the XVI Brazilian Physiotherapy Congress (COBRAF) held in São Paulo on October 7, 2005.

In 2023 the Association promoted it's 6th Brazilian Conference of Women's Health Physiotherapy in Vitoria, Espirito Santo State in Brazil and counted on the participation of the Professor Jean Hay-Smith from University of Otago, New Zealand as key-note speaker. Professor Jean talked about the preliminary results of systematic reviews conducted in collaboration with a PhD student at University of São Paulo Ana Carolina Nociti Lopes Fernandes, Professor Cristine Homsi Jorge and Professor Ana Carolina Rodarti Pitangui. Every two years the Association organizes an International Symposium on Research and Rehabilitation of the pelvic floor with the participation of Professor Kari Bo from the Norwegian School of Sports Sciences as key-note speaker, having already had guests from various parts of the world. The event will take place in November 2024.

The current aims of the Association is to encourage the promotion of Women's Health; To promote cooperation between physiotherapists working in the area of women's and pelvic health; to encourage improvements in Physiotherapy assistance provided in the area both in public and private health system; to promote excellence in clinical practice through the exchange of information at a National and International level; to disseminate women's health among

physiotherapists, other health professionals and the lay community through the promotion of Forums, debates, campaigns, symposiums and congresses; to encourage scientific research and collaborate in the development of new knowledge around women's health; to seek support and cooperation with national and international Associations that have similar objectives. Without a doubt, one of the objectives that stands out today is to seek to influence public policies to offer the population access to the work of physiotherapists in women's and pelvic health, in addition to offering guidelines for excellent work by physiotherapists in this area

ABRAFISM has publicized its actions using social media, especially Instagram and Telegram. On Instagram we have grown exponentially, currently having twenty thousand followers. We have frequently held live events, posted educational materials and directed the lay and scientific community, in addition to numerous guidelines produced by the association. ABRAFISM identifies the population's access to quality work by physiotherapists at different levels of women's health and pelvic health as critical problems. Our campaign "For more Physiotherapists in Maternity settings" has focused on the important work of physiotherapists in maternity wards, with all their potential for transforming obstetric care. This campaign was launched in 2019 and continues to win laws in several Brazilian states, with a federal law in the works. The campaign is coordinated by Professor Cristine Homsi Jorge (Scientific Director of ABRAFISM) who, together with the Executive Committee and experienced volunteers professionals, has provided numerous training courses for evidence-based practice in maternity settings.

In 2023 we launched the second e-book of the campaign, this time with a summary of all the achievements.https://abrafism.org.br/campanha-maternidades

The production of guidelines for clinical practice has also been a major focus of the association's work. In 2024, the following documents were produced:

- 1.Prevalência a Avaliação da dor em mulheres- Prevalence and Assessment of Pain in Women
- 2. Diretriz de Terminologia para reportar disfunções do assoalho pélvico em Portugues/ Brasil- Guideline for reporting pelvic floor dysfunction in Portuguese/Brazil
- 3. Recomendações ABRAFISM: Atuação fisioterapeutica em gestantes de alto risco. ABRAFISM recommendations: Physiotherapy in high-risk pregnant women

We plan to continue offering training across the country to qualify the assistance provided by physiotherapists in Women's Health and Pelvic Health. Also to produce books and new guidelines on various topics related to Physiotherapy in Women's Health and Pelvic Health. We will hold the 7th International Symposium on clinical research focused on the female pelvic floor in November 2024.
