
Get Involved: Your School's Guide to Participation

TEACHER RESOURCE

The attached resource was prepared by a team of Youth Empowerment Volunteers. The volunteers who contributed to the school resources include a retired teacher, a Registered Psychotherapist (Qualifying), a York University Psychology student, an Educational Assistant as well as our <u>Youth Ambassador!</u>



What is this feeling?

Using a deck of cards assign each suit one of the following emotions:

Happiness, Excited, Worried, Angry

Have each student take a card

Ask each student to share an experience where they felt the emotion on their card and how they expressed this emotion.

Do they think they would have liked to express it in a more productive way? Does anyone in the class have ideas of how they could have responded in a productive and healthy way?

Allow the students to explore and share their emotions, highlighting the fact that only they can control how they react to emotions and that when we take the time to think, what is this feeling?, we have the chance to decide the most productive and healthy way to react.
